Looking and Seeing, by Pastor Dan Lyman

Last winter we had an abundance of bird feeders and attracted a lot of birds, right outside our window at the back of our house. But this winter we had taken the feeders down because the birding community worried about spreading avian flu in the wild bird population. A couple of weeks ago, we put the feeders back up again because it doesn't appear to make much difference anymore whether the birds gather or not. Avian flu is all around and hungry birds are more susceptible to the flu than well-fed ones. So the feeders are back up. In the first week or so, no birds came, and then one or two, now there are a lot, depending upon the time of day.

My Grandma Lyman was a birdwatcher. She was also a book lover, so she had many books on birds. I inherited some of them. Grandma lived out in the country with an oak forest all around her house. Sometimes we would sit outside and "birdwatch." I put that in quotes because grandma (even with her cataracts) would say, "Oh look over there, a red-winged blackbird!" I would look where she was pointing and I did not see anything. I spent years like that, looking but not seeing. But gradually I began to see.

Luckily, Grandma had some easy-to-see birds in her woods. I remember a red-headed woodpecker that was pretty close. That one was easy to see. I got better at it. One time Grandma heard an owl hooting away and we rushed out to look at it. We sat quietly and strained our eyes. The owl would hoot and we would realize that we were looking in the wrong place. Then the owl blinked his or her big eyes and that little bit of motion zeroed us in. Even looking right at the owl it was hard to see. It matched the oak bark perfectly. Seeing it, we stared at it. Then the most wonderful thing happened, it swooped down and flew away. Beautiful, elegant, silent.

There are many wonderful things and wonderful people to see. It helps to look. It is good to see the blessings in the world and in the people all around us.

### History of the Baptism Quilts Project

This meaningful project began in 2000, initiated by a devoted member of the FLCW. At her own expense, she purchased the necessary materials and lovingly crafted quilts to be presented to each infant baptized. Her commitment laid the foundation for this tradition, which continues to bring warmth and comfort to families.

### Materials Needed

1½ yards of baby-appropriate cotton material for both the top and bottom of the quilt (baby flannel can also be used).

1½ yards of batting, either cotton or low loft. Alternatively, a crib-size batting (45x60 inches) in a bag is suitable.



## Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—February 16, 2026

**Pastor's Report:** He noted the graveside service planned on March 28 for long-time members Charley and Veryl Hein, the choir will sing as Veryl directed the choir at Faith for many years. He felt the recent chili event at Faith was very good. He noted that several congregations took part in a walk and candlelight vigil on Jan. 25, in response to the deaths of Renee Goode and Alex Pretti in Minneapolis. Pastor has also been typing the recipes for the 175th Anniversary Cookbook. In the wake of the situation in Minneapolis with ICE and issues surrounding immigration enforcement, Pastor agreed to have a person from Manitowoc address the congregation at the Feb. 15 service about an effort to give rides to immigrants who can't drive or don't want to now, given the current issues. He said it was distressing to hear that some people were upset with her after her talk. That generated a long discussion, as council members felt the talk became too political and such matters only divide the congregation, noting that the call committee specified when Pastor Dan was hired that no political issues should be discussed during services. Pastor felt the talk was just about helping our neighbors, but council members pointed out the sensitive nature of the immigration debate and felt the request for help could have been handled differently. Jim gave his thoughts, given his background in law enforcement, and later volunteered to speak personally to congregation members who were upset by the talk. (He gave a short Temple Talk the following Sunday to address the issue and felt the matter had been settled after talking to the people who had strong opinions.)

**Old Business:** Church Cleanup Day—Julie suggested a Saturday morning workday to clean up things inside the church, like windows and dusting etc. It would be best to get it done before Easter and the start of nice weather when outdoor work would be more pressing. It was decided we will have the cleanup day on March 14, starting at 9 a.m.

**New Business:** Openings on Boards and Council—Jim Schuessler volunteered to take the position of Board of Fellowship director temporarily until someone else steps forward. Alyssa Madson has agreed to remain Board of Christian Education director. There is still a need for one member of the Personnel Committee (3-year term), and two for the Nominating Committee (1-year terms). Soup and Sandwich donations-Fellowship Board suggests dividing the money between Faith Quilters and the pantry. A motion was made and approved to handle the funds in that manner.

### **Council representative reports**

**Treasurer's Report:** Terry submitted a written report. Joan noted that the form for the report has been changed and they are looking for council approval or comments on how to improve it. A discussion was held on CDs and whether we should shop around to see what rates area banks can offer. It was felt there would not be much variation. The special for CDs that was a seven-month period is now 11 months. Discussion was held on paying the Haven, Manitowoc Warming Shelter and Hope House and the motion from the annual meeting to take the money out of the designated fund. Each was paid \$1,000 after the annual meeting, based on that motion.

**Stewardship:** Joan made a motion that the endowment committee be allowed to use the funds given to it from the general fund (equal to 1% of all giving) for benevolence at its discretion with no further stipulation by the council and the principle may be spent. Motion made and passed. Fundraisers were discussed, such as a picnic with food trucks, a calendar or raffles. The question was raised whether the council wants to approve of having fundraisers, which would have to be approved by the council. To do so, we may have to amend the constitution. We also discussed having speakers come in to discuss ways to donate to the church, such as IRAs and naming the church in their will.

**Lay Ministry:** Jennifer noted that the liturgy at the Wednesday Lenten services will now be the Evening Prayer. The board would like the stripping of the altar to be more intentional during the Maundy Thursday service. They are looking for information on a digital hymnal. It was noted that some people have a hard time getting communion cups out of the tray, so those serving the wine should be aware of that.

**Evangelism:** We made \$279 at the chili event, which goes to the food pantry. They plan to send postcards for Easter again and maybe a letter after Easter to reach inactive members.

**Fellowship:** Jim will take over as director on an interim basis. Lenten Soup and Sandwich suppers are planned. We have a Thrivent action card for that. People need to sign up to provide the meals. There was a discussion on getting people to help with the fellowship hour and how to give the people who always do it a break. It was suggested that we encourage youth to help.

**Church Properties:** Loren noted that the furnace went out again and required a service call.

**Christian Education:** Bridget said the Sunday School students will make cards for homebound members or those in nursing homes as a spring service project. There was a discussion on when to have the confirmation service to avoid it being on the same date as the school choir concert. We also need to avoid Mother's Day when Sunday School kids sing. Can't move the date this year. Faith on Fire heard a talk by Kelly Meyer on Jan. 21 geared for confirmation students and their parents; Faith Yoga with Wendy Hutterer was held Feb. 4.

**Miscellaneous:** Pastor reported that he couldn't buy the grief group curriculum he had planned to get without signing off on beliefs Lutherans don't hold to. He found another one that's more expensive and suggested using money in the old Stephen Ministry fund to cover the difference and a motion was made and carried to allow that. Pastor also mentioned that he talked to Devin about the desire to someday have a pipe organ. He told the synod to let him know if a used pipe organ would become available. He is investigating one that might be free, but there would still be installation costs and a need to reorganize the sanctuary.

We adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:15 p.m. Next Meeting – March 16 –Submitted by: Mary Thomsen, secretary
