I just made arrangements for two weddings at Faith. It is good to talk and think about marriage. I know pastors who grump about weddings, but I like them. There are shows like "Bridezilla" that show brides and other people acting badly about their nuptuals, but those people apparently do not come to well-boundaried Lutheran pastors for their services.

In Florida, among the older population, I did few weddings. As a hospice chaplain I occasionally officiated at a wedding for a couple who had lived together for years, but never got married. And they got married as a nice thing to do for each other. I am no lawyer, but I have heard that you have to be married for a certain amount of time to claim your spousal Social Security, but that amount of time was not in the cards for them. So they were not marrying for money, just for love.

All those people who "didn't think they wanted to get married," they all said, "Oh we should have done this years ago," once they were married. I would try to unpack that when I talked to them. Nothing tangible changed, but something intangible was different and they were happy about it.

Early in my time in Florida a couple came to me and said they wanted to get married in a church service. I said, "Okay, just set the date and get the license and we will do it." And they said, "No, no, not a state service, just a church service." Then they explained to me that she was getting a pension because of her late husband, but if she got married again she would lose the pension. "A good pension!" she said. So they wanted to marry, but only in a church service, no license.

I did not like it. The senior pastor was sick and I was the assistant pastor, which is why they asked me. I think the senior pastor would have done it, on the principle that God's laws are superior to man's laws anyway. But the senior pastor resigned due to health reasons and the interim senior pastor took the decision out of my hands. He decided not to do it, on the principle that sometimes love means that you have to give up something, in this case money. When we say "for richer, for poorer" in our vows we take it seriously. We do not do dowries anymore. We try to see marriage as something other than a financial agreement. I am pretty sure I agree with the interim pastor.

I think the couple found somebody else to do the "church service" but I don't know for sure because they did not invite me to the service. So don't ask me to do your "unofficial" wedding, but please, I am happy to do your real wedding. "Living in sin" sounds a lot more exciting than it proves to be. Living together and have kids and a house and all that, but not married? Come get married and something intangible happens. It is pretty good.



Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—June 19, 2023

Guest Discussion: Guitar/piano lessons – Sue Riesterer. Sweet Sounds piano & guitar instructor, Samantha Henschel, from the Chilton area, took off during Covid & is starting up again. Her cost would be \$25/half hour lesson. She is willing to come to Faith if she has a minimum of 4 students taking lessons here. Pastor Dan encouraged having a recital at Faith with her students taking lessons here. Sue will look into this possibility to get more information & see if there would be interest. Health Day – Sue Riesterer. Health Day would include the community – paramedics could demonstrate basic CPR to provide awareness of what may be done in an emergency. This would not involve any certification. Information would also be provided where all our health emergency equipment is kept and how to use it. It was also suggested that symptoms of a stroke or heart attack would be provided. Blood pressure checks could also be provided by members who are nurses. Blood pressure checks could also be done after a church service on a regular basis. A motion was made and carried and approved to go ahead and schedule a health day on a Saturday in late September with paramedics here to provide basic CPR information, including location and description of what our medical emergency equipment does and provide blood pressure checks upon request.

Old Business: Rubber mulch. Erin sent samples around – black is cheapest at \$2,685 and \$4,230 for colors. We have collected \$2,105.06 in donations for the playground mulch. A motion was made and carried to order the black mulch at a price of \$2,685 or may also shop around for cheaper source. Hands on Mission: Discussion on how this became a committee and why it is under Evangelism. Currently limited to donating funds to local organizations.

New Business: Discussion on 60-year anniversary of Faith Lutheran Church building and how to celebrate. Date suggested was the first day of Sunday School. Pastor Dan suggested a pig roast which could also include a corn roast.

Council representative reports:

<u>Stewardship</u> – *Stephanie Mittnacht*: They will continue to work on proposed updates to financial policies. <u>Evangelism</u> – *Julie Hartman*: Helping Friday evening with celebration and will have someone here with new member info if anyone is interested talking about a new member directory and who we could hire to take pictures – could develop a special task force for this.

Lay Ministry - Joyce Sorenson: July 23rd - four men called "Redeemed" will sing 5 songs during the service. Fellowship – Marilyn Robley: Senior Appreciation Dinner September 6. Event would include members 75 years and above, past pastors, quilters. A motion was made and carried to approve holding the Senior Appreciation Dinner on September 6, 2023.

Property – Mark Zutz: Invoice was received from Braun Building Center for down payment on shed materials - requires 50% of cost down (\$2,103.38.)

<u>Youth and Family Ministry</u> – *Gretchen Spindler:* Carnival night for VBS is Friday, June 23 from 5:00 – 8:00. Youth event to the Brewer's Game was fun, and another event (possibly an outdoor movie) is being planned for this summer. Combining the two boards has been tabled due to conflicting views.

Close of Meeting: Having completed all business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:11 pm. Meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer
