Patience and Green Tomatoes Pastor Dan Lyman

As I write this article, my garden is filling up with green tomatoes. I see them, even hidden in the green foliage. One day they will be ready to pick and eat, but not for a while. And when the season finally comes, it will seem like they are blossoms one day and plump, red-ripe fruits the next. But they are not in that season yet. The season they are in now is the season of hanging there as green as grass for weeks.

So we wait. Gardeners need patience. To take a seed and plant it, is an act of faith. Faith and patience.

Around my house this summer we have taken a few short cuts in the garden, in the form of potted perennials that we can plant and they still bloom this summer. So they are doing what we want them to do right away. And, next year, being perennials, they will do it more and more and more. Daisies and black-eyed Susan multiplying in the sunshine, hostas filling the shady spots with their cool green beauty, the apple trees filling out. So your pastor spends his day off with a shovel in his hands. Shoveling and waiting for red tomatoes.

Tomatoes are part of why I love to garden. I also point to the Biblical passage in which the purpose of humanity is revealed. In Genesis 2:15, "The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it." We are <u>meant</u> to be gardeners. But personally, it has been mostly tomatoes. (Adam must have walked around with a shovel in his hands waiting for tomatoes too.)

The sheer abundance of tomatoes that come in a good year is remarkable. We eat all we can hold just grazing in the garden, then fill a basket, and eat more, fresh or cooked each meal, and let them pile up until we can can them. It used to be a common complaint that store bought tomatoes were pale, tasteless things. They are better now. I admit it. But verily, verily, nothing compares to a real tomato from the garden.








Calling All Musicians

Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—June 16, 2025

Pastor's Report: The baccalaureate service on the Valders High School graduation day on June 1 was well attended, with 30 graduates attending. He, Al and Bridget attended the Synod Assembly in Green Bay on June 7, and it was a positive day. Pastor noted that Pastor Mervin Thompson, son of Pastor Conrad Thompson, a son of the congregation, preached at Faith on Father's Day. He reflected on our church roots and Norwegian heritage. He left a copy of his sermon with Pastor Dan to file for information for future anniversary events. Vacation Bible School was successful, with 61 kids, 15 adults and 13 high school students involved. Pastor visited Al Gilbertson after his surgery. A memorial service was held for Eric Clayton Coble and William Ross Corace on June 4 at West Cemetery. Pastor gave plans for service coverage during his vacation June 25-July 2. Faith will have a float in the Valders parade on August 3. He suggested putting flyers with the warning signs of a stroke in the restrooms at church, as is done at First Lutheran. Tanyia will help find suitable flyers.

Old Business: Roof tiles have been fixed. Onkka Bench: Loren will call Valders Stone and Marble about the bench and figure out what decorative blocks to use as a pad. May add a path to the playground equipment. Joan suggested thinking of having another bench in the future for Pastor Peters when placing the bench. Time and Talent sheets: Joan asked board members to look over the sheet to see what needs updating.

New Business: Bill-DVR/Camera: A quick fix was done after a recent failure during a service and is working well, but it's impossible to know if/when it will fail again. The upgrade will leave the cameras in the same spots and have a larger swivel area. The quality of images will be significantly better with a sharper picture on screen. Bill noted that camera prices have risen drastically, and the company allows a shorter time for bid updates due to price hikes and tariffs. \$15,000 will be needed to replace all three cameras and the controller, however, to change the DVR and make everything compatible, another \$3,000 is needed. The advantage is all the equipment will be new. The current system is 16 years old. The upgrade work will eliminate 90% of wires in place and install new wiring. The board discussed whether to try to raise money before authorizing the purchase, but there is concern that prices could rise. Bob suggested cashing out a CD to get the funds now and place the money raised laser back into a CD. Motion to upgrade the system for about \$18,000 was made and carried. Motion to use accumulated interest from the most recent CD and Keil memorial fund money and then take the rest from the undesignated fund was made and carried. The new security cameras and new phone system are up and installed. Youth Fund CD: Motion to roll over was made and carried.

Council Representative Reports

Stewardship-Joan: Preparing for stewardship drive in October, with a three-week campaign divided into Time, Talent, and Treasure. Would like people to get up and speak about personal experiences in each category. The board is looking for council members to speak about the money aspect and to have people talk about how the church staff has affected them, as the largest part of the budget goes to personnel.

Lay Ministry-Jennifer: On August 17 there will be worship and a picnic at Union Park in Manitowoc at 10 a.m. The service on that day at Faith will be 30 minutes long and we will move Communion to the next weekend. No fellowship here that Sunday.

Evangelism-Julie: Working on parade plans and God's Work. Our Hands.

Fellowship-Marilyn: She thanked parents who bring their children to VBS and those who help. She also thanked those who bring treats for weekly fellowship.

Youth & Family Ministry-Tanyia: They received only four responses to a survey about family events.

The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 7:40 p.m. Next Meeting – July 21, 2025


