#### The Blessing of Music

One of the great blessings of my life was to become involved in vocal music. I had always liked singing, tho nobody had said "Oh boy are you a good singer!" I got involved in 8th grade with the chorus. By high school my fellow singers were my closest friends. (And a disproportionate number of them went into the ministry. I do not know what that means.) One of my favorite memories from those days was when, at Christmas time we would all get together and go caroling. We would pile into cars and show up at a house and just go up and ring the doorbell and then sing. "Angels We Have Heard on High" with all the parts beautifully sung in perfect harmony is very beautiful any time. But on a crisp, snow-covered night to have beautiful rosy-cheeked teenagers surprise you with angel choruses, it is glorious. It is part of my Christmas joy.

To this day I remember the names of all the eight tiny reindeer from the intro to "Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer" from singing it dozens of times out on the lawn of neighbors houses. "You know Dasher and Dancer and Prancer and Vixen, Comet and Cupid and Donner and Blitzen, but do you recall the most famous reindeer of all?

At home from the beginning of the Christmas season, we always used to listen to "Handel's Messiah." We had an album with the Mormon Tabernacle Choir singing it. Then in choir we learned it and sang it. And over the years I have sung it many times. In church we read the assigned scriptures around the Nativity and they are exactly the words that Handel set to music. So every Christmas as I read the words to you I want to sing them in Handel's thrilling tunes. "Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God!"

I am especially thankful for the musicality of this congregation. For the depth of dedication to musical excellence Faith Lutheran Church displays.

Sometimes people ask, "What is the best Christmas present you have ever received?" and I have to answer, "The music of Christmas!"

May you receive good gifts and may your heart sing with the joys of the season.

## Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—October 16, 2023

**Pastor's Report:** Reviewed his written report of activities in the last month, including hospital & communion visits, visioning event on 10/1, First Communion retreat on 10/8, graveside service for Peggy Madson, Baptism for Emery Ann Ewen, First Communion for 7 students, participation in 10/14 Health Event, and attendance at several Board meetings. Notes were taken at Visioning event and will be taken to appropriate boards for action.

Old Business: Discussed changes included in the updated Financial Policy. Members must fill out a form for reimbursement of expenses incurred on behalf of Faith Lutheran. Committee chairs (directors) must approve expenses that will be charged to their budget before they are paid. Updated financial policies will go into effect as of February 1, 2024, when newly elected positions begin. A motion was made and carried to approve the changes to the financial policy.

New Business: Board of Lay Ministry proposed Holiday Services: During the week of Thanksgiving, the Wednesday night service will be moved to Tuesday night & will be a special Thanksgiving service. Christmas Eve lands on a Sunday – There will be a regular Sunday morning service at 9:00 plus the 3 Christmas Eve services at 3:00, 5:00, & 10:00. There will be no service on Monday, Christmas Day. A motion was made and carried to approve the holiday services as proposed.

Budget: Stephanie passed out a first draft of the proposed budget for 2024 with numbers she was provided from the various boards. The expected budget increase in the budget from last year is \$7,000. Benevolence is currently at a total of 8% & will remain the same in the budget for 2024. Security and computer updates: Bill proposed getting cameras for two of the other doors (main upstairs entrance and main lower-level entrance) so Christine is able to see who is coming in. The cost would be \$1,380. A motion was made and carried to purchase additional security cameras for the upper-level main

<u>Lay Ministry</u> - Live streaming of Wednesday evening services has been discontinued due to a lack of volunteers. Health Day was held October 14<sup>th</sup> and Opportunity Day on October 15<sup>th</sup>. October 29<sup>th</sup> is Reformation Day, 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday Sing-along and potluck brunch. Veteran's Day will be remembered at the November 12<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday night service. Advent sing-along will begin at 8:50 before Sunday morning services during Advent.

<u>Property</u> – Parking lot should be done next year – Bid of \$28,000 – Mark proposed taking the \$20,000 CD & put it towards the parking lot when it becomes available instead of renewing it again. A motion will be made to do this at the time the CD becomes available. Other items on properties wish list include window replacement in Fellowship Hall & three upper-level business offices, and lower-level bathrooms remodeling.

<u>Christian Education</u> – Communion Retreat was held on October 8<sup>th</sup>. 7 students attended and each painted a ceramic chalice that was fired at Glaze & Paint in Manitowoc. They will be on display for First Communion October 15<sup>th</sup>. The Sunday School Christmas program will be December 17<sup>th</sup>. Sunday School students will sing on October 29<sup>th</sup> for the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday Sing-along.

Youth and Family Ministry – We have at least 2 youth interested in attending Junior High Blast. Stacy will chaperone for the girls. If no male chaperone volunteers, male participant(s) may join with another group. Lefse sales will be held on 10/22, 10/25, 10/29, 12/1, and lefse will be made on 11/10. Christmas caroling at Manitowoc Healthcare Center on 12/15 at 6:00 with pizza & hot chocolate after at church. Kids Night Out – 12/27 – cookie decorating and snow related activities if there is snow. Faith on Fire event on 10/18 - "Glow Closer with God" including a pumpkin carving contest, a glow game, campfire with s'mores and hot dogs, as well as a bible study. October 21st there are 20 kids signed up to go to the Haunted Golf Cart Rides. November 15th there will be a speaker coming to talk about courage and resilience. In as Much Sunday – 12/3 – WELLS (Spancrete) is also collecting gifts & will bring them to us for distribution.

<u>Endowment Committee</u> - Pastor Dan reported that he attended their last meeting & they have many plans for benevolence.


