Thinking About Christmas by Pastor Lyman

In the United States, Christmas is celebrated as our largest holiday. We seem to celebrate Christmas for days and days, in sacred and secular ways. But in the rest of the world it is quite different. In Spain, for instance, Christmas Day is very much a church holiday. The bells ring and everybody walks to the cathedral to thank God for the birth of the Christ Child. Then later, the bigger holiday is Epiphany, when the wise men arrive. That is when they celebrate with moderate gift-giving and feasting.

There are not a lot of Christians in Japan (about 2% of the population) but they, surprisingly, celebrate Christmas. They celebrate, not with Jesus, but with Santa Claus. It just caught on over there.

We start our Christmas season officially on the first Sunday of Advent, but it starts <u>un</u>officially for all of us on Thanksgiving, right after we eat our pumpkin pie. And the retailers start it on Halloween!

In other places the season starts on December 6th on the saint's day for Saint Nicholas. He was a saint who was good to children and he also gave gifts. People found it natural to connect the patron saint of children to the Christ child, so Saint Nicholas became Sant Claus.

In my own tradition, the Swedes celebrated Santa Lucia on December 13th. She is the girl with a crown of candles you sometimes see. Her story of sainthood has her miraculously providing food during a famine. In modern times she is essentially the patron saint of cookies. And cookies and Christmas also go together.

Sometimes lost in the noise of Christmas is the surprising love of God that is shown in our Holy and Most High God leaving the throne of Heaven to come into the world of sinful people, the Almighty becoming vulnerable, the invisible becoming visible for our sakes. Let us give thanks, Merry Christmas!


Faith Lutheran's Youth Christmas Program Sunday, December 15th at 9:00 am

The Manitowoc Warming Shelter (MWS) provides a safe, warm, non-judgmental facility for any adult that finds themselves without safe overnight shelter during colder months. MWS's third season saving lives will run November 13 through April 11. This collaborative effort of local churches, organizations, and volunteers is currently housed at First Presbyterian Church in downtown Manitowoc.

Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—October 21 2024

New Business: Christmas wreath- we need a new one. Julie will take care of purchasing a new one. A motion was made and carried to purchase a new Christmas wreath. The church will use money from the undesignated memorial fund (amended to take it from interest placed into the general fund). We also need to replace the existing tree located in the gathering space as the one we have is in poor shape. A motion was made and carried to purchase a new tree for gathering space. It should be pre-lit, and money for it will come from the undesignated memorial fund (amended to take it from interest placed into the general fund). A couple of bank CD's are coming due for renewal—one is due on October 22nd, another for \$50,000 Renewal (Faith on Fire). Discussion generated the decision to roll over the principal for CDs, and to put the interest into the general fund. Then that interest can be used to pay for the wreath and the new tree. A motion was made and carried to roll over the principal only of the two CDs, and to place the interest generated by them into the general fund. It can then be used to pay for the new wreath and Christmas tree.

<u>Lay Ministry</u> – *Jennifer Ott*. The funeral pall has been dry cleaned. All Saints will be a part of the worship service on November 3rd. Thanksgiving week there will be no Wednesday night service; it will be moved to Tuesday, the 26th to allow for travel and family preparations. Christmas activities will be: December 7th, decorations to be put up December 24th – three services will be held, at 3:00 p.m., 5:00 p.m., 10:00 p.m. December 25th – service will be at 9 a.m. January 11th – decorations to be taken down.

<u>Stewardship</u> – *Joan Pritzl*. Stewardship drive is underway. Jill suggested electric & gas bills could be combined into one account. As they're paid together, there won't be any change.

Evangelism – Julie Hartman. Julie Hartmann has already contacted someone about the design for our Christmas postcards which will be done through the Valders Journal as before Welcome folders are up to date-3 are ready in the cupboard. We currently have no new members, but we've had two baptisms a month since September. Language training-members of the board are reaching out to the farmers in the area. Pastor Dan has t-shirts for Spanish families if need is found. December 1st advent workshop, we ordered a craft, volunteers are needed to help that day. Advent resource - Pastor Dan ordered advent calendars, rejoice in hope, and Just add Jesus recipe books. Julie Endries has contacted the Salvation Army to see what is needed for the sharing tree. Judy Valleskey is making Christmas cards for our service members and will put them out for people to sign the first two weeks of December. We all need to be looking for new members to join our board. As Julie E will be leaving when she moves. There will be a fundraiser for the warming shelter on Dec. 14th. Pastor would like us to bring it to the council that we add them to our budget. Fellowship – Marilyn Robley. They have been asked by Pastor Dan to get ready for March 11th, synod is coming here for a meeting during Lent. We are host church; therefore, we'll need to prepare their food.

<u>Property</u> – *Mark Zutz*. Windows installed last week; with a bit of altering on some, they made them fit. Outside work is finished; inside they still need a nice molding. We need blinds; those we have are in poor shape- Joan will look at pricing for those. When the work is done, we need to paint fellowship hall.

<u>Christian Education</u> – *Alisa Madson (May be reported by Larry &/or Bridget)*. They are discussing the advent workshop for Dec. 1st. They're practicing for the Christmas program- Dress rehearsal will be on Dec 8; the program will be on December 15th.

<u>Youth and Family Ministry</u> – *Gretchen Spindler*. For the 2025 Youth and Family budget: No changes are needed. We had our youth fall event yesterday which went well. 15 kids attended; pictures were posted on the website. A reminder that lefse making will take place on November 15th. A sign-up sheet for ordering will be up in the gathering space.

<u>A couple added notations</u>: Al Gilbertson – he and a few others have been straightening headstones in the West Cemetery, doing it for free. Thank you to him for that. A big thank you also to Doug Meyer, Jeff and Terry Evenson for helping with the windows, also to Marilyn and Sue for providing a meal for them. And a shout out to Joan Pritzl for taking over the web site, keeping it up to date, and the confirmation students are doing a great job filling the greeter spot for worship ministry.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting at 7:55 pm. Meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting: November 18, 2024; Devotions – Judy Harris.
