This Dorothy Divers painting is donated to Faith Lutheran Church from the Estate of Robert &
Dolores Onkka.

My parents, Robert & Dolores Onkka, lived in Valders from 1960 to 1973 while my father served as the first pastor of Faith. Robert Onkka helped bring the 3 existing small parishes together to form Faith Lutheran Church. The design & construction of the stunning church building was done under his leadership. Faith, the members, the community of Valders & the surrounding area held a special place in the hearts of Bob & Dolores. It is both exciting & very satisfying to see a part of their lives return to Faith Lutheran Church.

While in Europe at the end of WWII & his service with the US Army my father bought a few pieces of original local art that he brought home. This was the beginning of a lifetime of buying & surrounding himself with art. Dolores shared this passion.

After marriage & the raising of 3 small children both of my parents picked up art pieces that spoke to them. Over the years they accumulated a collection of original art. They did not buy art from dealers, nor did they sell from their collection. Their walls & shelves were full of treasured pieces.

My mother passed away in 1989 & my father in 2020. As executor I & my remaining sister, Susan, have been distributing this art to family, friends, their colleagues & institutions. The Rahr Museum, for example was given a 1960's painting by Manitowoc artist Carol Bell. Which brings us to this Dorothy Divers painting.

This painting hung in dad's home office so it had a place of honor. On the back in my mother's

handwriting she wrote:

Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—February 20, 2023

Pastor's Report: In preparation for goal setting, we need to think about what our dreams are for Faith Lutheran. Holy Spirit works like a puzzle – we each have a piece of the puzzle & together we create the whole picture. What is in our heart for Faith – what tender feelings do we have for Faith? What is the next step? What Pastor Dan has heard that we want for Faith: stability; no conflict; youth continue past Confirmation; financial strength continues; VBS continues to be great; Sunday school & all children's ministries stay great; we all like each other better. What Pastor Dan did not hear that we want for Faith: I want to be more active, I want more adult activities, we need adult Bible study, I wish Faith had competitive elections FLC should conform to my expectations – provides an amazing spot for moving ahead with whatever it is we decide to do. At the recommendation of Pastor Dan, a Visionary Day was scheduled for Sunday, March 19th 10:30-2:00. The current Council and other leaders of the congregation & youth will be invited.

Old Business: Playground equipment—Metal equipment is out of our price range. Wooden equipment is likely what we will need to go with Pastor Dan recommended not limiting the project to the \$10,000 Onkka gift & raising additional funds needed from a congregation fundraiser to ensure the project is done well. He suggested getting pictures of potential playgrounds to show congregation when introducing the fund raising for the project.

New Business: Executive Council recommendation for hiring of Youth Coordinator. Bill Riesterer reported that an interview was held on February 1, 2023, by Executive Committee with applicant Bridget Valleskey. Currently provides daycare in her home. Very positive attitude. Unanimous decision to recommend hiring Bridget. Recommended starting salary is \$26,500 with an increase to \$28,000 after required training is completed. Pastor Dan recommended other training possibilities may be available. Pastor Dan would like the Youth Ministry Coordinator to be responsible for leading Sunday School to start with, or at least be responsible to recruit someone for the currently vacant position. The Personnel Committee should review the Youth Ministry Coordinator job description and consider including management of Sunday School as part of the job duties. Bill Riesterer will complete all personnel duties involved with taking on a new employee. A motion was made and carried to approve the hiring of Bridget Valleskey as FLC's Youth Ministry Coordinator with a beginning annual salary of \$26,500. This salary will increase to \$28,000 after required training is completed. Bill reported on a letter he received regarding an issue of being unable to hear service speakers. The letter shared information on a special speaker system that works directly with hearing aids. He also shared that several of the Praise Band cables are worn to the point of needing duct tape to keep them together.

<u>Stewardship</u> – *Stephanie Mittnacht*. Should a portion of our check book balance be put into a higher interest-bearing account? Interest rates have come up, which makes it more worthwhile. Bank First has a seven-month CD at a rate of 3.5%. A motion was made and carried to invest \$50,000 in a seven-month CD with Bank First.

<u>Lay Ministry</u> – *Joyce Sorenson*. \$655.00 was collected as a free-will donation for the Pine Haven Men's Choir. These funds will be used to provide raised garden bed for residents of Pine Haven. On the first Sunday of each month, Faith will return to kneeling communion at the altar.

<u>Evangelism</u> – *Julie Hartman*. \$227.00 was raised from the Chili Cook-off, which will be donated to area nonprofit organizations assisting homeless people. Sending out a postcard to make members aware of Holy Week services.

<u>Fellowship</u> – *Marilyn Robley / Sue Riesterer*. Marilyn inquired whether Fellowship would need to serve dinner for the Visionary Sunday. It was determined to order pizza from Luigi's.

Property – Mark Zutz. Lawn fertilizer was ordered for the entire year, which saved 10%.

<u>Christian Education</u> – Larry shared information about a March 11th Confirmation student fieldtrip to Congregation Beth El in Sheboygan. This is a reformed Jewish Synagogue, which provides service in English and allows intermingling of men & women attending services.

Youth and Family Ministry – *Gretchen Spindler* (Reported by Erin). Easter Breakfast will be held again this year. About 15 youth attended an ice-skating event held recently.

Endowment Committee – Pastor Dan. Looking into alternative investments that would provide higher interest rates.

Having completed all business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:28 pm. Meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
