

## Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—October 18, 2021

*Housekeeping Items:* The Lion's Club has decided not to do the Breakfast with Santa this year. They did instead have a brat fry with the Boy Scouts, its proceeds to go to pantries in the area, for hams, etc. for Christmas.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Mortgage Burning; Symbolic burning of the mortgage loan, which has been paid off, will take place immediately following the service on Sunday, October 24, 2021. Fellowship will be serving cinnamon rolls, cut in half, with coffee afterward. The burning will also be done after the Wednesday service, after which Stephanie will have a treat for those who come.

NEW BUSINESS: Community Dinner: Lions Club has asked if there is any interest in serving a community dinner again, probably in spring. Terry Huske organized others previously, so Ron will talk to her about this. Estate Money Designation: Pastor Onkka's Estate has gifted us with \$10,000, unspecified as to how they prefer it be used. It will be put into the Memorial Fund. It is felt that it should be designated for something substantial and tangible. Therefore, it will be added into the fund as a special line item, so that it cannot be absorbed into the budget for light bulbs, etc. Suggestions include: Carpeting, lights in fellowship hall, Substantial improvements on building. Motion was made and carried to put the gift from Onkka estate into the Memorial Fund as a separate line item "Pastor Onkka's gift" and designate it for improvements. Treat bags for the kids after the Christmas service. We received an email requesting permission from the Ralph Christianson family to renew the giving of treat bags to Sunday School children following their Christmas program. Covid had prevented this last year but it had been an 80-year tradition for the family that had been well received and they would like to continue. Motion was made and carried to accept the Christianson family's offer to distribute treat bags to the Sunday School children following their Christmas program. A "Noisy offering" was requested by Katie Thomsen in accordance with her work at Concordia College, a project challenge to the students for which Katie is raising money for people in need in the Milwaukee area. We discussed the idea of matching what is raised by the noisy offering from our local benevolence fund, deciding we could match the amount collected by noisy offering rounded up to next \$100. Motion was made and carried to match the amount received by the noisy offering from our local benevolence, rounded up the nearest \$100.

Stewardship - Stephanie Mittnacht. Next year's budget information is coming in, and she is working on it.

<u>Lay Ministry</u> – *Joyce Sorenson*. Voices of Peace were unable to come. Church holidays have been determined through Christmas. All Saints Day will be on November 7<sup>th</sup>. Thanksgiving will be held on Tuesday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> at 6:15 pm. The Christmas program will be on Sunday, December 19<sup>th</sup>. Christmas Eve services will be three: at 1:00 pm, 3:00 pm and 5:00 pm. Christmas Day service will be (Saturday) at 9:00 (instead of 10:00). There is a possibility that there may be no service the following day -the Sunday of 26<sup>th</sup>. (Pastor will be on his way to India). We'll do Lessons and Carols on the 2<sup>nd</sup> January.

**Evangelism** – *Julie Endries*. They would like to display a Christmas wreath like last year on the outside church wall; they need permission and financial help, possibly from the Undesignated Memorial Fund, to make this happen. Motion was made and carried to allow funds not to exceed \$150 from the Undesignated Fund for the wreath to hang on the outside wall of the church. Pastor Grant from the synod will be at their meeting on December 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 to speak with Evangelism (also in Pastor Jim's place Sunday, Nov. 28<sup>th</sup>). Evangelism invites Council members to come listen. Hands on Mission is looking for clarity of tasks, for what they should be doing. There is nothing in the Constitution that defines their actions, so they are looking for some direction, what they should be doing, for someone to possibly take charge. The Sharing Tree will be put up the last week of October.

**Fellowship** – *Cheryl Domrath*. Their committee meets every Sunday while they are serving, rather than on an official date or time of meeting. This seems to work best with their members, partly due to Covid, and she's wondering if this is all right. The Council thought it fine; things are getting done, fellowship after the Sunday service is going well. Quilts are usually put on the pews during November and left on for the month. It was decided this would be done again for this year, along with envelopes to be found in back for voluntary contribution to quilting.

<u>Youth and Family Ministry</u> – *Erin Lenzner*. We held an event at Otto's Pumpkin Patch last Sunday and had a nice turn out. Lefse sales have begun and will continue through October. The lefse event will be November 19-20th. Also, "A Walk Through Bethlehem" is being planned to take place again in December this year.

<u>Call Committee</u> – *Ron Jones*. They had received advice to re-work and update their questions to candidates, which they did. They had a virtual interview with a candidate from the East Coast, but didn't work out mostly because he did not have experience with youth. Gretchen Spindler joined their group. Pastor Grant was here from synod to speak to them and give some pointers. <u>Endowment</u> – Minutes were received from their meeting on October 13, 2021, which detailed the work they have been doing and their intentions for holiday giving. They also made a gift donation to the Cancer Benefit for Harry Kwasny.

<u>Adjourn</u> - Having completed all business, a motion was made and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 7:28 pm. Next meeting on November 15, 2021 at 6:30. Devotions by Judy Harris
