The Breath of Life

Prayer is the breath of life in our relationship with God, both individually and as a congregation. It's not something we do to please God, but to stay connected to God. It is two way: we speak to God, and we also listen for that still small voice within. It is important to *not* make prayer into a chore, or a work, but a part of our love for God, like communicating with a beloved parent or mentor. It can be as quiet and simple as just being aware that God is there and that God cares: practicing God's presence.

Many years ago, I heard a teaching on prayer by Pastor Rick Foss. What stuck with me was that we have all learned how to talk with and to others. We know how to share our needs, express gratitude, say we are sorry and ask forgiveness, how to say what is important to us, speak words of love, and we learn how to listen to one another. Prayer is simply doing what we already know how to do, but with God.

One of the key ways Jesus showed his love for his Father was by regularly engaging in prayer. Throughout the Gospels we read how Jesus "went up to a mountain to pray" or "knelt down and prayed" or "continued all night in prayer." As Jesus prayed, he gained a clearer sense of who he was (his identity) and what he was to do (his mission). Before he taught or healed, before choosing the Twelve or submitting his will to the Father in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus prayed. Whatever the opportunity or challenge, Jesus turned to his Father first and sought the guidance and help of God the Father.

As Jesus' disciples we need to follow in his example. Especially as we journey through 2022. Faith is in the call process. There are still questions to be answered. We need to seek God's guidance and divine help. Remember the Call Committee and Church Council in your prayers. Pray that God would help them have a clearer direction in this call process. Ultimately, the future of Faith is in God's hands. So pray!

Soup for the Souls recently made beef barley soup. It is available for our homebound members and is in the freezer in the Gathering Space. Please share with them when you visit.





February Stewardship

Fabric Kits

<u>Two</u> pieces of cotton or cotton blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester). Fabric should have no stains or holes and cut into pieces measuring:

- 2 ½ yards of 60" wide fabric (4 ½ yds. total) or
- 3 yards of 44" wide fabric (6 yds. total) or
- 4 yards of 36" wide fabric (8 yds. total)
- 2 spools of matching or neutral colored general purpose thread

(250-300 yards each)

Look for material on sale. Items donated should be marked <u>fabric kits</u> and placed inside the stewardship cabinet at the top of the stairs near the church office. If you want to only get 3 yards of material, get the 44" wide and include 1 spool of thread. Look for the cheaper bolts. Mark how much material you have. We can match the same color material to make up the 6 yards needed.

Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—December 20, 2021

Pastor's Report

Visits: Included 5 home visits, multiple phone calls and emails and funeral service.

Meetings: The Senior Breakfast and meetings with the Board of Evangelism, Youth and Education and the Council. Confirmation classes were held on Wednesdays and Sundays.

OLD BUSINESS

Policy: Use of the Church: Change was made to "no use of alcohol". Added fellowship hall maximum capacity 427 people (11 sq. ft. per person). A discussion point came up for possible future consideration: do we need to add the possibility of an activity being bumped (i.e., for something like a funeral)? How do we handle that sort of thing- do we want to set a policy or treat it as a case-by-case situation? Probably we should think it over and discuss again.

Seasonal decorations in gathering space, and Christmas greenery on choir loft. Julie Hartmann did a good deal of decorating with the total of receipts of \$316.46. These decorations are reusable and will not need to be repurchased. Altar Guild (which is under the BOLM) has money, mostly from Mary Haupt, and doesn't mind using some of the money for reimbursing Julie. Motion was made and carried to reimburse Julie Hartman for the seasonal decorations used in the church with money to be taken from Altar Guild memorial funds.

NEW BUSINESS

Budget proposal to be presented at the Annual Meeting reflects the following: Changed benevolence; an increase in the amount given to the ELCA. Properties maintenance was increased. Tech support; a line was added to separate tech support from Pulpit as this is actually not part of the pulpit but something separate and distinct. Which of 3 budgets to approve? Only one budget can be presented. The choice was made.

Motion made and carried to raise Benevolence to ELCA by .25% (total Benevolence goes from 7.75% to 8%). Motion made and carried to add a separate line for technology support instead of leaving it as part of pulpit supply. Motion made and carried to accept and propose to the congregation the 3rd column budget, which plans allowance for Pastor Jim remaining part time and the possibility of a new full-time pastor for a total budget of \$77,528.

Thrivent Money: Right now, goes to Hands on Mission and Faith's Pantry; (Pantry establishes it is fine right now). \$3,000 is ball park amount we will get. This year: ½ to National Youth Gathering; ½ to the Bible Camp fund in the memorial fund. Motion made and carried to approve these funds.

Ballot for Annual Meeting (January 23rd): Bill Riesterer for Vice President Elect. Auditing Committee: Cheryl Duchow; Kerry Schnell; Earl Griffin. Nominating Committee: Mike Zutz. Youth rep for Council: Garret Ulness. **Evangelism** – *Julie Endries*. Just a reminder: Pastor Asher will be present for a continuing conversation from the December meeting at the Board of Evangelism meeting on February 1st at 6:00.

<u>Property</u> – *Lyle Roehrig*. In the fellowship hall, they are not going to replace the ceiling tiles after all, but will be doing the lights, LED only and fixing the broken fixtures. It was pointed out that the blinds in there are tired and could use replacing. They will look into that.

<u>Call Committee</u> – *Ron Jones*. During the 1st week of January, the Call Committee will be interviewing a possible candidate for pastor; it is a married couple; both could have something to offer us, as he is a pastor; she has training as youth director if we might want to hire one in the future. A note of caution though; at this point there is no motion by personnel to hire a youth minister; so, for the moment we can't talk about that with her, not until personnel has a meeting and recommends to Council for approval the hiring of a youth minister.

<u>Adjourn</u> - Having completed all business, a motion was made and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:09 pm.


