As a pastor, I am on the mailing list of all the church supply and Sunday School curriculum companies. And so there has not been one day in many years that I have not received a sales brochure or catalog from them in my mailbox. I often leaf through them to see if there is anything new. Once you buy your robe and altarware, your banners and candles, your audio equipment and video equipment, there really are not too many supplies you need. But seasonally (and for Vacation Bible School) you need a new thing. One of the companies pointed out that the hymn, "Amazing Grace," is 250 years old this year, and they created a Lenten emphasis for it.

I like "Amazing Grace." Its message of God's loving salvation for sinners is very Lutheran. I have known many people who list it as their favorite hymn, and we will even sing it at their funeral. So I bought the Lenten meditation books for our Lenten journey, and there will be an Amazing Grace bulletin insert. The theme of our Lenten Season will be "Amazing Grace." I will talk about it in my sermons.

I have started teaching "Amazing Grace" to our Sunday School kids. The kids can mostly understand it, "I once was lost but now am found; was blind but now I see." They understand that part. But I struggled to explain what a "wretch" is. I said it was someone who is "wrecked" like a wrecked car. But I know literal minded children will imagine physical wreckage, and only later understand spiritual damage.

It is a song that grows with you. I had a 102 year old church member who called it her favorite hymn, who would get tears in her eyes when we sang it in church. We all got tears in our eyes when she made a special effort to come to Vacation Bible School that year to teach it to the little children who had never heard it before. She told us she was proud to be the person starting them on perhaps a century of loving "Amazing Grace."

I invite you to come to a deeper understanding, a deeper relationship with God's amazing grace this lenten season! Pastor Dan

# PINE HAVEN MEN'S CHORUS at Faith Sunday, February 12 for worship Come and listen to the melodic voices of this chorus.

The Pine Haven Men's Chorus was organized in 1951 to supply financial help for the elderly residents residing in the Pine Haven Christian Home in Sheboygan Falls. The Chorus was formed by a quartet from each of the supporting churches of Sheboygan County. Later the Chorus was open to any men who love the Lord and enjoy singing His praises. The membership numbers 30, in addition to an organist, a pianist, and director, Glenn Moore. There is one charter member and many longtime, dedicated members. The Pine Haven Christian Home has grown immensely since 1950 and now encompasses three campuses. Two campuses are located in Sheboygan Falls and one in Oostburg. It is now called *Pine Haven Christian Communities*. The Chorus prepares a Christian concert each year to praise God and raise funds to provide a better Christian atmosphere for the residents, such as a chapel on the main campus, courtyards with landscaping, fountains and streams, signage in front of the main campus, remodeling of the employee lounge and the list goes on.

A free will offering will be taken this day and given to the Pine Haven Christian Home.

February Stewardship is Fabric Kits

Two pieces of cotton or cotton blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester). Fabric should have no stains or holes and cut into pieces measuring:

2 ½ yards of 60" wide fabric (4½ yds. total) or

3 yards of 44" wide fabric (6 yds. total) or

4 yards of 36" wide fabric (8 yds. total)

2 spools of matching or neutral colored general purpose thread (250-300 yards each)

Look for material on sale. Items donated should be marked <u>fabric kits</u> and placed inside the stewardship cabinet at the top of the stairs near the church office.

If you want to only get 3 yards of material, get the 44" wide and include 1 spool of thread. Look for the cheaper bolts. Mark how much material you have. We can match the same color material to make up the 6 yards needed.

The Mixed Choir continues to meet each Sunday at 10:15 in the Music Room across from the Library. We encourage anyone who enjoys singing to join us. We try to keep the music simple and familiar so please consider partaking in this group. It's a good way to meet other members and to share your talents with our congregation. We plan to sing once a month until Memorial Day. Take time to get a cup of coffee and a snack and bring them with you. During Lent we plan on singing one song "with" the Sunday school children. This should be a fun experience for both groups.

## Greetings from Crossways!

As we reflect back on 2022 and begin to look ahead at 2023, we wanted to inform you of the important work of the Crossways Board of Directors as we manage through the transition of Executive Director.



After thoughtful discussion and consideration, along with consultation with the leadership at Lutheran Outdoor Ministries, we have determined our best approach is to bring on a seasoned and experienced Interim Executive Director to work with the board and lead the organization through the process of preparing for our next long-term leader.

As a result, the Board has unanimously voted to hire Scott Merrow as Interim Executive Director of Crossways Camping Ministries, effective December 1, 2022. Scott has spent more than thirty years working in the camp and conference center profession and non-profit organizations. His experience includes working with boards, staff and stakeholders as an agile, forward-thinking leader that builds strong, thriving, financially fit organizations that continually seeks to use resources efficiently to produce maximum outcomes and impact. Scott started his career in camping at Calumet Lutheran Outdoor Ministries in New Hampshire and has worked with organizations with varied missions including youth and family ministries, disability programs, juvenile justice, and community centers in underserved neighborhoods.

Scott lives in New Hampshire and will make visits to Wisconsin monthly in addition to working remotely. The board is confident in this arrangement and has agreed with Scott on a detailed outline of the tasks that it is asking Scott to accomplish during his time with us. Among this work is developing the board to create a mission and vision for a sustainable and impactful ministry. Scott will also focus on staff development, stakeholder outreach, and will serve as a resource for industry best practices. Now is a great time for the board to be in consultation with someone as adept at helping non-profit ministries evolve as Scott.

Scott will be with us through June 2023 by which time the board is anticipating being in the process of calling a permanent executive director. During this time of transition, The Board is committed to ensuring having the right person be in place at the right time. While Summer 2023 is a good goal, the timeline remains flexible.

### Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—December 19, 2022

#### **Housekeeping Items**

Use of Pastor Onkka's Memorial money: Erin looked into the possibly of getting both a nativity and also some playground equipment; she reports: We would need no extra insurance; it's already covered by our liability insurance. Prices are all over, ranging from \$2,000-\$30,000. We need more detailed information regarding what is available, what prices they will give us, what type of each, in order to decide the best way to use this money. The Board of Evangelism had been looking into the outdoor nativity sculpture. The prices on outdoor sculptures seem to be wide-ranging as well, depending upon how elaborate you want to go.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

2023 Proposed Budget: A fairly large deficit was found to be in the original budget proposed for 2023. The board looked closely at each line item to determine if figures were realistic and should be left as is or could be trimmed.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Youth Coordinator proposal: Since we currently have had no good candidates for our youth coordinator position and we have \$200,000 in our checkbook, we could take \$100,000 out for focus toward getting a youth coordinator? Perhaps to pay this person \$30,000 for 3 years, that maybe with an increased salary we would have better luck in attracting a knowledgeable and responsible person to take on the position. The congregation has al ready approved the hiring of a youth director, so the main question would be how to set it up. It would go into a separate line outside the general fund, specifically labeled, and a time limit placed on it. If no one is found in the allotted time, the money would return to the general fund. The Council agreed to do this. A motion was made and carried to set up a separate account of \$100,000 from the general fund, but outside of it, for the purpose of seeking a Youth Coordinator. This will be for one year, to be reviewed after that period as to whether it is fulfilling the purpose or should be put back.

#### <u>Lay Ministry</u> – *Joyce Sorenson*

They will be getting rid of the extra keyboard. The extra piano has been tuned, will be advertised. There will be two stations for communion at the 3:00 and 5:00 pm services on Christmas Eve.

#### **Fellowship** – *Cheryl Domrath*

They served during Walk through Bethlehem- punch was served, a large number of people came for the children's program.

#### **Christian Education** – *Gretchen Spindler*

In As Much Sunday was December 4<sup>th</sup>. The toys received were donated to lakeshore foster families and friends.

#### Youth and Family Ministry – Erin Lenzner

The lefse making was done, and all of it done in 1 day. Walk through Bethlehem, went okay, though attendance seemed a little low (25 people total between Sunday and Wednesday) for all the work done. Some people did come from other churches.

#### **Personnel Committee** – *Mike Zutz*

End of year meetings held with Ken & Christine.
