
We hope you enjoyed the delicious soup, the opportunity to socialize and next year you might want to share a favorite soup with your Faith Family. Thank you for your generosity.

- Please place your items in the stewardship cabinet across from the church office.




You aren't going to believe it! It's happening!

### Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—March 21, 2022

**Pastor's Report:** Meetings with several boards; BOLM, Evangelism, Stewardship, Council and a synod meeting. With his impending retirement in May, he generously offered us a document to continue his support as a supply pastor, from June 1<sup>st</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>, which we approved and signed.

Housekeeping Items: Use of Pastor Onkka's Memorial gift. Several options were discussed concerning how this money could best be used. Several good ideas were brought forth from the various boards. Of the options suggested we thought that, since we currently don't have much in the way of outdoor decoration art for Christmas, a wooden or metal nativity set would not only add to the church but also be something significant and specific to reflect how involved Pastor Onkka had been with our church and its very founding. Julie will do some research on pricing. The Sabbatical Policy drawn up some time ago was officially approved as its actual approval date could not be located. A motion was made and carried to approve the Sabbatical Policy as previously discussed and drawn up (8-12-2019).

<u>Old Business:</u> Youth Coordinator. Since things did not work out as hoped with the last candidate, this position is again open and needs to be posted in as many places as possible. Suggestions for places to post included Tentmakers (out of Minneapolis), Indeed, and Crossways. Comment was made that before doing so, the personnel committee might review the salary to decide whether it is still a viable offer.

<u>New Business:</u> Concerning Pastor Jim's offer to become a Supply Pastor-member feeling on this was unanimously in favor. A motion was made and carried to approve Pastor Jim's contract to become a Supply Pastor from May 30, 2022 through October 31, 2022. Our search for a new pastor: Pastor Jim noted-talking to Pastor Applehans at the synod office it was mentioned that the idea of expanding our search to look outside the ELCA as well, may not be as quick as we had hoped. They are still hopeful for finding a pastor for us, however. Right now, Council can't do anymore; things are back in the hands of the synod and call committee.

<u>Stewardship</u> – *Stephanie Mittnacht*: A request was received from Youth and Family (Expanded Ministry) regarding a need for funds for a planned Friday VBS excursion to the Aquatic Center. Since they are doing Friday differently this year, in keeping with the school program, they would like to reserve the Aquatic Center in Manitowoc for an outing for the kids and their families for the evening, from 7-9 p.m. A motion was made and carried to approve up to \$500 to Expanded Ministry to fund an evening outing on Friday after VBS for youth and their families at the Aquatic Center in Manitowoc, from 7-9 p.m.

<u>Lay Ministry</u> – *Joyce Sorenson*: Joyce mentioned, merely as a heads-up: they are looking into the possibility of sending an interested person to the conservatory for lessons as a bell choir director. The lessons would be less than \$100; their board would reimburse the student for the expense. Right now, this is only in the talking stages. **Evangelism** – *Julie Endries*: Nothing outside their minutes.

<u>Fellowship</u> – *Cheryl Domrath*: They are looking at serving something special for Mother's Day, and possibly for 75-and-up folks in early June. They will be providing service at the Aquatic Center VBS outing.

<u>Property</u> – *Lyle Roehrig*: Tony has been helping Ken finish projects before summer and things are going well. Bill mentioned (so that we know who to contact if needed) that he is willing to take on the responsibility of being a keyholder, after he received a call from the sheriff's department when they checked the doors, and found them unlocked.

<u>Christian Education</u> – *Anderia Frank*: VBS is scheduled for June 20-23<sup>rd</sup>. Confirmation service will be May 15<sup>th</sup>. Set up for Easter Breakfast will be at 1:00 p.m. on April 16<sup>th</sup>

Adjourn: Having completed all regular business... A huge thank you was given unanimously by Council thanking Lyle Roehrig for his years of service to FLC as he is moving out of area. Then a motion was made and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:08 pm.
