I wanted to take a moment to say "thank you" to all of you who helped in our very successful Adopt-a-Family program this past Christmas season. Whether you adopted a family (or several) or collected specific toys or items (gift cards) for certain age groups or just gave a monetary amount for the program, we are grateful. This year, as a result of your wonderful generosity, we were able to adopt 96 families. All together those families received 2628 toys, 447 items of clothing, 44 food items, 220 personal care items, and 561 household gifts.

In addition, many gave gift cards this year to the tune of \$20,000 worth. These gift cards were a blessing to families through our toys for tots/toy shop program as well as our Adopt-a-Family program. All in all (adopted families and toys 4 tots families), our community helped us provide gifts for over 1300 children in need in our county, serving 582 families (96 adopted & 486 through toys 4 tots).

We couldn't do any of it without you. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts! Thank you for helping to #RescueChristmas for so many hurting families.

HANDS ON MISSION COMMITTEE Annual Report

2020 has been a year of unknowns and anything but usual. We had to cancel fundraisers and community events for the entire year. Our first meeting was in July!

HOM committee is blessed to have a diversity of church boards represented: Cheryl Domrath - Fellowship and Faithful Quilters, Arlene Roehrig - Evangelism, Joan Pritzl - Stewardship, Terry Huske - Lay Ministry as well as Bill Bratz and Wayne Huske. These people bring a good insight as to the happenings of our church.

Since we could not do any fundraising, we are appreciative for the support we received from Thrivent Choice Dollars totaling \$1,726.50. These funds were put to good use to help support non-profit organizations in Manitowoc County. Donations were made as follows: Hope House - \$250, The Haven - \$250, In Courage (formerly Domestic Violence) - \$250, Salvation Army - \$500, CORE Treatment Services - \$250 (This facility opened in Spring 2020 and is a 16-bed residential and day-treatment center to help alcohol and other drugs-of-abuse clients.) FLC missions included Soup for the Souls - \$300 and Mission Masks - \$271.10 (This is a group created by April Meyer to fill a need in the community. Recipients are nursing homes, hospitals, Piggly Wiggly, and Valders Schools.)

Since the Faithful Quilters could not send quilts to LWR this year, they decided to help closer to home. Quilts were made for our shut-ins and nursing home residents as well as others who needed a comforting quilt. The quilters also dedicated time at each gathering to make masks for Mission Masks.

2020 was unpredictable, but we can still see God's blessings in so many ways. We look forward to what He has in store for us in 2021!

Lay Ministry's request to move funds from Memorial to Bell fund. Lay Ministry recommends to the Council that they be allowed to move \$400 from Undesignated Memorial Funds account into Bell fund, so that needed maintenance can be done if it should arise. Motion made and carried.

Recommendation by Stewardship to pay down additional loan principle Stewardship is recommending that we pay down the Capital Appeal with an extra one-time mortgage payment of \$40,000 on the principal (which would cut mortgage in half). This would be in addition to the extra \$1000 tied to checkbook balance. Reasoning is that interest will become variable in February of 2022—would be best to have as little left as possible. We do have enough in the checkbook to pay down this much. Motion made and carried.

MSP review, specifically compensation amount. The Call Committee has been updating information on the Ministry Site Profile. Current compensation specifics and amounts were listed on member handout. The Call Committee does not address compensation, which is up to Council. Are the numbers specified relevant, affordable, and suitable? Discussion followed, considering all matters involved, including amount of experience, housing, sabbatical, other benefits, some negotiable, some not but which add to the final package. Motion made and carried to set compensation amount to a range of \$65,000 to \$80,000.

<u>Youth Coordinator Report</u>—Stacy Schwoerer. We have 15 in confirmation; all are on track; next week, January 27th there will be an informational meeting to go over requirements and to share with parents how to go forward to keep kids on track. Sunday school – is a work in progress, with effort to find new and better curriculums and activities.

<u>Lay Ministry</u> – *Joyce Sorenson*. Purchase of the Clavinova has been made. A question was asked if members could possibly get those little sealed communion cups that are not being used to take home for communion on the TV? Joyce will check into it.

<u>Evangelism</u> – *Julie Endries*. They are planning a slight web site tweaking to make the online worship services easier to locate. There was an anonymous donation of pens labeled with our web site and phone number printed on them. These are to be distributed. They are looking into the possibility of gathering memorabilia about the churches for the gathering space in conjunction with the anniversary celebration.

<u>Fellowship</u> – *Cheryl Domrath*. They're planning to do something each month in recognition of 3 churches coming together. Jan 31st; they are planning to be giving out Donut Holes and hot chocolate to kids.

<u>Property</u> – *Mark Zutz*. They did order the parts for windows. Mark and Lyle will do the work when weather is cooperative.

<u>Christian Education</u> – Anderia Frank. No report

<u>Youth and Family Ministry</u> – *Bobby Jo Robley*. Easter breakfast—they are wondering about doing a drive-thru?? Covid is making logistics difficult for their normal activities.

<u>Adjourn</u>

Having completed all business, a motion was made and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 7:53 pm.


