Plant 4 rows of Squash: Squash Gossip, Squash Indifference, Squash Grumbling, Squash Selfishness


Plant 4 rows of Lettuce: Let us be Joyful, Let us be Faithful, Let us be Kind, Let us really love one another



Valuable tips to protect your identity from Church Mutual

We have all established our individual identities. However, some people are not satisfied with their own--they want to take yours. Identity theft has become a common problem in the United States with an estimated 9 million people affected annually, according to the Federal Trade Commission. Here are important tips to protect your identity.

Mailbox theft - Especially common after year-end, when such documents are mailed, identity thieves steal preapproved credit card offers, tax information or stock brokerage and bank and credit card statements. In another twist, thieves steal pieces of mail you have left out for the carrier and learn your name, address, account numbers, and even how you sign your checks. They open a new account elsewhere and have statements sent to another address.

Change of address - Thieves take it upon themselves to file a form with the U.S. Post Office, diverting your mail to another location to steal your personal information.

Internal Revenue Service - Someone mails you a bogus IRS form that you are asked to complete and return with your personal information so they can process your refund.

Workers - Domestic help or contractors enter your home with your permission and collect social security numbers and other personal information from documents you have left lying around unsecured.

Charitable appeals - A person calls, claiming to be with a reputable charity, and requests a donation. They ask for your credit card and other personal information.

Refinancing offers - A bank or refinance company calls offering you a great rate. You are asked innocent questions at first, followed by someone asking for your social security number so they can check your credit in order to get the most favorable refinance rate.

Spousal problems - Thieves call during the day, posing as a credit card issuer, to inform you that your husband or wife has a payment that is overdue. Playing on your guilt and embarrassment, they request personal information to resolve the problem.

Tax refunds - You get a call from someone who claims that you are entitled to a significant tax refund — they just need your credit card number to charge the nominal shipping expense and social security number to confirm the amount.

Email phishing - Someone posing as your provider sends you a note offering to upgrade your service. The email has a link to a website that looks identical to the one your provider uses. You are asked to enter your personal information. Thieves then use the data to open new accounts and make purchases.

Hacking around - Identity thieves hack websites containing your personal information or account numbers, such as catalogue companies. They use that information to create new accounts.

Skimming - A waiter or other service person at a business where you are making a credit card purchase passes it through a small electronic device that copies the magnetic strip and other details. These are later transferred to a machine that makes a fake card.

Credit checks - Posing as your employer, landlord or someone else with a legitimate reason, identity thieves request firms with your records to supply your social security number or other personal information.

Inside job - A co-worker in human resources or payroll with access to your personal information sells it to identity thieves who use it to create a new you and new accounts in your name at another address.

Shoulder surfers - Thieves watch from a nearby location as you punch your telephone calling card or credit card information into a telephone, computer or ATM machine.

TIPS TO COMBAT THE THREATS

Guard your social security number - Store your card in a secure place. Use it only when necessary such as on tax forms, employment records, banking, etc. Do not have it printed on your checks and do not supply it to merchants who want to write it on your checks.

Destroy documents at disposal - Shred ATM receipts, copies of credit applications, insurance forms, physician statements, checks and bank statements. Destroy expired credit cards or credit offers you receive in the mail.

Shop warily online - Use only a credit card — not a debit card. Designate a single, distinct credit card with a low limit specifically for online shopping. Use a secure browser, looking for the lock symbols in the status bar at the bottom of your browser window. Look for the words "Secure Sockets Layer" or "SSL" in the merchant's privacy statement. Never send payment information via email.

Practice safe computing - Update your virus and spyware protection software regularly. Download and install security patches for your operating system or browser. Use a firewall program, especially if you use a high-speed Internet connection that leaves your computer connected 24 hours a day. Before you dispose of a computer, use a "wipe" utility program to overwrite the entire hard drive and make files with personal information unrecoverable.

Pick personal identification numbers (PINs) carefully - Do not use a part of your social security number. Do not use anything a thief could deduce such as birth dates, address, telephone number, consecutive numbers, pet's name or mother's maiden name. Memorize your PINs — do not write them down. When in retail establishments or at an ATM, shield the PIN pad when entering your number.

FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH ANNUAL COMBINED BUDGET/ELECTION MEETING

Sharing God's Word, Showing God's Love, & Serving God's World

January 23, 2022

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President Ron Jones at 10:05 am. A total of 42 members were in attendance in the sanctuary. **Devotions-** Opening Devotions were provided by Pastor Jim Wilson, on the subject of looking ahead, in thinking about calling a new pastor, and, perhaps as in Isaiah 6:8- "Whom shall I send?" paying attention to God's calling in our own lives. **Minutes from the Annual Budget/Election Meeting, January 26, 2020:** printed in the Annual Meeting booklet each person present received. Motion was made and carried to approve the minutes as prepared from the January 24, 2021 Annual Budget/Election Meeting.

Special report from the Call Committee

As head of the Call Committee, Joan Pritzl reported that they are in the process of interviewing a prospective candidate who might be especially suited to our needs. They wanted to let the congregation know because, at this point, not only does this pastor appear to be a good and qualified candidate, but also his wife has training with youth and is interested in a position we've had previously, and are currently in need of, that of Youth Coordinator. They would therefore like to urge the congregation to positively consider the upcoming amendment to the proposed budget that will be coming up later in the meeting. Stefanie Kaderabek, also spoke on behalf of the Sunday School staff to please consider approving this budget amendment, saying that right now they are working without a leader, running the Sunday School on their own, and that they truly need help and direction.

Review of 2022 financial data - Board of Stewardship Director, Stephanie Mittnacht. Please note that the budget was drawn up prior to knowledge of the possibility of finding a Youth Coordinator.

Proposed Budget for 2022 - The budget for 2022 was drawn up to plan allowance for Pastor Jim remaining part time along with the possibility of a new full-time pastor, and therefore totaling \$77,928 for a pastor. This budget also reflects the following: Changed benevolence; an increase in the amount given to the ELCA. This had generated some discussion among council members. A vote was taken, the increase passed by majority of hand vote. Properties maintenance was increased. Tech support; a line was added to separate tech support from Pulpit supply as this is actually not part of the pulpit expense but something separate and distinct.

Approval of 2022 budget - Motion was made to accept the proposed budget as printed, and amended with the addition of the amount for the hiring of a Youth Coordinator. A voice vote was taken, budget passed.

Elections for Faith Lutheran Church leadership positions for 2022

Pre-printed ballots with the nominations reported by the Nominating Committee were distributed to members in attendance and presented to the congregation. The ballot was gone over, at each position a call was made for nominations from the floor. No nominations were added from the floor.

New Business – Since our budget had money left after the Capital Appeal was finished, the Council had decided to create a building maintenance fund inside the General fund. It was done mainly for clarification for tax purposes.

Opportunity for comments from congregation -Comment was made regarding the passing of the amended budget. The proposed budget, as it has been amended and approved, now gives us a deficit going into the upcoming year. It was thought that it is never a good idea to move forth with a budget that contains a deficit, that this would be unwise. Discussion followed. At its conclusion, it was decided that since the new budget does contain an allowance for a maintenance fund, and the checking account, which is not counted in the actual budget, has sufficient funds totaling a greater amount, if we consider wants against needs in the building maintenance, there would be enough to move \$15,000 from the building maintenance allotment into a line for creation of the Youth Coordinator position. This would balance the budget. Comment was made by Stefanie, emphasizing the great need for leadership of the youth; that if things do not work out with the impending interviews, if these people do not join us as pastor and youth coordinator, that the position of youth coordinator please NOT be dropped, but that we keep looking until we fill the position.

Motion was made and carried that \$15,000 be moved from the newly formed building maintenance fund for creation of the position of the Youth Coordinator.

Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—January 17, 2022

Housekeeping Item: We voted in November to create a building fund; there was discussion on how to set it up. Right now, people who donate have no tax form for this, but do get a receipt from Christine, or another option is to set it up like the Capital Appeal. A motion was made and carried that we start a building maintenance fund for the Property Board.

OLD BUSINESS: Policy for use of the church. Following our discussions from previous months, a revised form was handed out by Pastor Jim--- it was decided also that if the Council won't meet before the date usage is to take place, the person allowed to give approval would be either president or VP (for outside groups-- as Spancrete had, for example). Motion was made and carried to adopt the Facility Use Guidelines as drawn up and looked over by Council members. Policies adopted in the last 5 years: Ron and Christine did go back through the minutes and found we had adopted two new policies in the past 5 years: On November 19, 2018(?), a motion was made to establish funeral visitation in sanctuary. On April 15, 2021, a motion was made that funeral food will now be catered. Judy will add these to our separately created Policy Manual. The Fund-raising policy has been a long-held policy, since Pastor Onkka's time, and is hanging on the wall in the church office. It covers things like raffle tickets, etc., fund raisers to supplement the general fund are not allowed.

NEW BUSINESS: Youth Coordinator back in the budget? Discussion of this brought up a number points: There are but a few people working in youth, and, with little support, they are getting worn out. We are in danger of losing some good people if some leadership is not found. We definitely NEED somebody to be a backbone; if this is not done, the congregation could be in trouble. Because the budget is already finished and approved for presentation to the congregation, and it does not yet have allocation of money for this position, it cannot now be edited *before* giving it to the congregation, and therefore, we cannot approve this position at this meeting. HOWEVER, at the budget meeting; a member of the personnel can bring up addition of a youth coordinator position as an amendment, and it can then be added to the budget and approved by the congregation. The position must be clear on numbers and hours of work. *[note: If the person being considered for 20 hours or more is the partner of the pastor, benefits must be offered (disability; pension; health). However, since a special meeting would be called at the time of hiring, this part could be worked out at that time.]* Robert Pautz, has volunteered his services and will become the new financial secretary. This is a position that is appointed by Stewardship. Motion was made and carried to appoint Robert Pautz as financial secretary. The Board of Lay Ministry would like to make its annual request to move \$400 in their budget into the fund for bell maintenance. Motion was made and carried to move from their budget for bell maintenance. Don Domrath is hoping also to get a choir going again, and needs a piano that easily transposes down in the music room; for now, he is just bringing this to our attention.

Fellowship – Cheryl Domrath: They have been having a lot of people coming to Fellowship Hour. The quilts have been very well accepted and appreciated, and have received thank you notes from those who received them. It was noted that Elma Castro is currently in Texas and while there, she is doing great mission work making up many care packages.

Christian Education – Anderia Frank: Sunday school has been struggling. They are not sure how to proceed, wondering about perhaps moving to every other Sunday? Maybe Wednesday? They are looking for direction as to what to do? June 20-24th is VBS.

Youth and Family Ministry – Erin Lenzner: April 17th Easter breakfast, but maybe not? At this point in the planning stage, and it depends on where things go.

Call Committee – Ron Jones: They had a good virtual interview with a perspective candidate, and will meet him in person for a 2nd interview during the 1st week in February. Funds were approved for their expenses incurred to drive up here.

Adjourn - With thanks from Ron and to him for his term serving as president-

Having completed all business, a motion was made and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:27 pm.

Next meeting on February 21, 2022 at 6:30. Devotions to be determined.
