When Jesus ascended to heaven he left his followers with a mission, "Go make disciples... Be my witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea and to the ends of the earth." What they did next is recorded in Acts 1:14. They went back and "They all joined together constantly in prayer..." They prayed that God would empower them through the promised Holy Spirit to speak his Word and move people to faith by that same Spirit.

It is the work of the Holy Spirit to touch hearts. Our work is to share God's Word and to show God's love. But the foundation of that mission is prayer. My prayer is: "God water the seed of your Word with your Holy Spirit so that it may grow in people's hearts and lives. Lord, may it begin with me: empower my witness and my love for all."

As Luther put it in the Small Catechism, "I believe that I cannot by my own under-standing, or effort, believe in Jesus Christ my Lord, or come to Him. But the Holy Spirit has called me through the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, and sanctified and kept me in true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it united with Jesus Christ in the one true faith." God waters the Word with his Spirit that it may grow in our hearts.

Sunday, May 23rd we remember and celebrate Pentecost. Pentecost is sometimes called the birth of the church. After being in prayer for ten days God poured out his Holy Spirit upon the disciples. They became Apostles-which means "sent-ones". Jesus handed his mission of gathering people into God's kingdom to these new Apostles. 2,000 years later we have become a part of that on going call to discipleship, to gathering people into God's kingdom so that they may know the depths of God's love for them in Jesus Christ, God's Son. Lord, use us to carry out that mission.

We do that through ministries like Sunday school, VBS, confirmation, worship, quilting, Bible studies, sending our youth to camp, the food pantry, and supporting other ministries that also share God's Word, show God's love, and serve God's world.

The foundation is faith in Christ, and like those first followers, praying for God to use us to touch lives with the Gospel and love of Christ.

Financial Report for the first 3 months of 2021

Each month I produce a financial report and present it to our Church Council. I have decided to also start posting this report on our church bulletin board. This report gives a summary of where we are financially at the end of each month. It also gives a comparison for the past two years.

There is also a summary of the Faith Lutheran Memorial Funds, the Capital Appeal Mortgage, the balance in the Hands on Mission Fund, the Luther League Fund and also a record of our attendance.

In February of this year we received a check from the Government for \$7,040. Last Spring we applied for the Government SSI loan through the Covid rescue plan. When we received this we returned it as we didn't need it at the time. For some reason the Government gave this back to us with interest more as a Grant instead of a loan. If you look at the Financial Report in the April Faith Matters this \$7,040 was included in our income. Our Stewardship Board has recommended to the Council that this sum be given to several organizations that were affected by Covid and not used for our own budget. Therefore you will notice that the Financial Report in this Faith Matters reflects a negative net income. This means that our offerings have been less than our expenses. Since we still have a positive amount in our checkbook all our bills have been paid.



Housekeeping Items Valders Rummage Sale-Cemetery Association Brat Fry, May 7th. The Faith Cemetery Association will be offering a brat fry here on May 7th, serving all day from the little red barn built by the Lion's Club. Country Visions will help with freezer provision. Thank you to Valders Journal-Judy will make sure a note of thanks is sent for the services they have provided during the past year.

OLD BUSINESS Starting in September, Kelly Meyer will be going to seminary; he is now in the process of registration. Most classes will be online but he will occasionally need to travel to Minneapolis. Endowment does have a Seminary Fund from which they can provide some financial help.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1. EID Loan is now a Grant. Last spring, because of Covid, we had applied for and received some aid money given to small businesses during the shut-down. One was a grant (PPP); we also applied for an EID loan of \$7000, which we subsequently paid back. During February this year, the government decided it was not necessary to pay it back, and so it was sent back to us. We discussed how best to use this unexpected money. Some suggestions were listed and handed out, for use either by donation or in various ways around church. In accordance with our mission statement, we are leaning toward donating it. A number of suggestions us made, among them (places helped by Hands on Mission): Hope House, the Haven (men's), the Crossing, Salvation Army, Core (drug abuse), In Courage, Crossways. It was decided that the council write down the suggestions and take them back to their boards to also get their input. We will talk about it again next month.
- 2. Camp Funding: Crossways- the camp is part of our Benevolence fund. There had been a 3-year pledge; further contact would be between Crossways and the individual donors who had pledged. Stacy Wilker had contacted Crossways, Don will ask her if she's heard anything in relation to this, and we'll come back to this next month.
- 3. Delegates to Synod Assembly (May 14, 15, 16). Registration is open for this meeting which will be done virtually. Those who attend also have a chance to elect members to go to the national convention. Ron has their agenda. Registration should be in, it is believed, by the end of April.

<u>Stewardship</u> – *Stephanie Mittnacht*. A reminder from Stephanie that toward the end of the 2^{nd} quarter, we will need to discuss what we will do with our Capital Loan, since we are due in to sign again.

Lay Ministry – Joyce Sorenson. They will offer drive thru communion March 28th 10:15 -11:15. They need to find a home for 2 pianos. Services on Easter: 7:00 a.m. - sunrise service with cross unveiling, 9:00 a.m. - service.

Evangelism – Julie Endries. Post cards have again been made available for sending invitations to join us at Easter and/or in worship.

<u>Fellowship</u> – *Cheryl Domrath*. This Sunday (March 21^{st}) is the first day of spring; cinnamon muffins will be given to Sunday School students in their classrooms and handed out, to go, at the end of service (without coffee).

<u>**Property**</u> – Lyle Roehrig. A wish list exists of things that we need to do, but that are not immediately imperative. On this wish list: Painting the sanctuary, it must be sprayed probably, costing around \$10,000? Light Fixtures in fellowship hall and classrooms. (Cost of heating & lighting is \$1000/month). There are some unneeded old computers and equipment in the library that Terry would like to get rid of; they would have to go to recycling and for that there is a fee. Lyle will not be doing the lawn this year, but he knows someone, currently working through Cemetery Association, who will do this lawn here and at West. To follow correct protocol, this will be brought to Personnel; Mike will recommend that he be hired. A question from Council to properties: can we hook our new system up with system for hearing impaired? Lyle will talk to Kelly. Properties has April 10th for clean-up (alt. date 17th) from 9:00-noon.

<u>Christian Education</u> – *Anderia Frank*. They've planned a trip the Railroad museum. A noisy offering will be done to raise money for camp.

Having completed all business, a motion was made and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 7:42 pm.


