No major commitment is required. Each segment is 15 - 20 minutes. It will be fun, like VBS. And it doesn't have to be every week. A sign-up sheet is posted on the Youth Bulletin Board.

Yeeeee Haw!!!! Sunday School is back!

Mark your calendars for Rally Sunday - September 19, 2021. The theme for Rally Sunday this year is **Round'em Up for Jesus**. Wear your favorite cowboy attire: boots, hats, bandanas, etc. will all add to the fun!

Our Sunday School students will be studying "The Life of Jesus" this year. Each week, kids will walk in Jesus' footsteps from his birth to his resurrection and ascension. Kids won't just learn about the historical Jesus - they will get to know him personally. They'll discover that Jesus is a real person - a real friend - who makes a difference in their lives today. We have many exciting events planned for Rally Sunday:



- 9:00 am Service Bible Presentation to Sunday School students entering grade 3, grade 7 and preschool students who did not receive Bibles last year; also bring your backpack for Blessing of the Backpacks!
- 10:00 am- The congregation, families and Sunday School Students are invited to join us for a hearty breakfast! Faith Lutheran Church in Valders will provide an egg skillet (in the big pan just like they prepare at Breakfast on the Farm), sausages, fresh fruit, cinnamon rolls and milk/coffee. There is no charge for the meal; we would like to bring everyone together to kick off a special Sunday School year. Please RSVP for breakfast by signing up on the sheet by the Welcome Desk by September 8th.
- 10:30 am After everyone has a chance to chow down, we will start our **NEW SUNDAY SCHOOL FORMAT**. Young buckaroos might recognize it as being very familiar to how Vacation Bible School works. Each week from 10:00-11:00 a.m. we will spend time reading from the Bible as a large group in Fellowship Hall, then we will break into small groups for rotations of playing games, making crafts, singing songs and watching videos to connect Jesus to our lives today.
- 10:45 am Children will complete the 3 rotations today after the large group Bible reading. Parents and members of the congregation may remain in Fellowship Hall to learn more about how Sunday School will work this year OR watch rotations of classes. Adults can sign up for teaching a rotation of Sunday School if they would like.
- 11:30 am Sunday School is dismissed for the day!

We are looking for our Adults and Confirmation Youth to guide kids on this exciting Sunday School journey!

- Sign up to lead the kids in areas YOU are comfortable sharing a Bible story, leading a craft, singing a song or playing a game. Each week, 3-4 adult leaders and Confirmation Youth will lead one of these elements with 3 different groups (15 minutes per group) that rotate through a station. On Rally Sunday, adults will have the opportunity to peek into classrooms and see what the kids are doing and consider helping out at Sunday School.
- No major commitment required! We will have Sign Up Sheets available at Rally Sunday and on the bulletin board outside of the Youth office for the Sunday/s that work for YOUR schedule. You may sign up for as many or as few Sundays that you are available.
- All lesson plan ideas will be provided. You can pick up the lesson plan anytime so you can look it over and be ready for Sunday School.

Lay School of Ministry: Equipping People for Christ's Mission

Lay School. It's a funny name, we know. But the term "lay" stands for laity from the Greek word for "people." Not everyone is called to pastoral leadership. But pastoral leadership is not the only kind of leadership that exists in the church. Through the baptized, the Holy Spirit is at work feeding, healing, teaching, restoring, and loving. That's what Christ's mission is all about.

The Holy Spirit equips and calls people to lead church councils, bible studies, Sunday school, and youth meetings. Some are called to serve on teams that plan for new pastors, engaging people in worship, sharing the mission of Jesus in community. Maybe God is calling you to deepen your sense of what faith is all about. If that's the case, lay school is for you.

Lay School is either a two year program with "Core Classes" that take you through the basics. OR, you can just learn one class at a time.

Fantastic classes are available to you and there is scholarship assistance ready if you are in need. Recent Christian History, deep dives into Old Testament texts and how we engage the bible, putting words to our faith through the practice of theology, taking time to consider what on earth is happening to and through the church these days... lay school has got you covered.

Time to register for Addiction & Faith Conference

The Center of Addiction & Faith will hold its third Addiction & Faith Conference, October 7-9 in Bloomington, Minnesota, to give faith communities tools for responding to the addiction crisis. Registration is open for in-person and virtual attendance at www.addictionandfaithconference.com.

The center grew out of the Fellowship of Recovering Lutheran Clergy. The Rev. Ed Treat was an active Lutheran pastor in 2018, when he held the first Addiction & Faith Conference. The success encouraged him to leave parish ministry after 25 years and dedicate himself full-time to the Center of Addiction & Faith, which became a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization in 2020.

Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—July 19, 2021

Housekeeping Items: Thank you cards received from Hope House and Salvation Army. Ron spoke with Bobbi Jo Robley about doing a church directory. She will consider it and let Ron know.

New Business: Continuation after Pastor Jim's contract is up— for the first half of 2022, Pastor Jim would like to continue the same agreement, which would take us to the end of May. The church could then consider him a "supply pastor" if there is a need. Kelly Meyer could be an option for supply pastor services as well, if available. There are two candidates for our open pastoral position. Interviews will be conducted next week.

Pastor's report: 2 home visits, 3 office visits, phone calls and emails. Attended BOLM, Evangelism, Stewardship, Youth & Ed, Council and Senior breakfast meetings. Attended confirmation camp from July 11-16 and also helped lead VBS.

Stewardship-"Blessed by Generosity" will be theme of our stewardship drive staring October 24th. Would also like this to be "mortgage burning day." At the end of June, less than \$20,00 left on mortgage. Motion made to pay off capital appeal loan in October. Motion carried. Cake and ice cream or a celebration of some kind is being planned for after church on that day.

Lay Ministry-Adding the bulletin back was discussed, as it is felt words are difficult to view on the power point. We are saving money by not printing them, but a simplified version could be considered which may be cheaper. Could also consider enlarging the font on the power point or dimming the lights.

Evangelism- There is question as to whether there is a value or need for staffing the welcome desk. 15 minutes before and after the service is being considered. Evangelism will discuss this further and pursue.

Fellowship- "Round Em' Up for Jesus" will be the theme for Rally Sunday. A luncheon meal was discussed. Parker Johns, Brian's Smoke House are possible options for catering the event. There is money available for funding this. Would want people to make reservations. Meal after VBS went very well. Served 125 people Subway sandwiches and everything was very smooth. Cost was covered by a Thrivent card plus an additional \$150 for a total of about \$400. Youth to begin assisting with serving coffee/juice after services.

Church Properties-New railing along the north entrance. There is a leak in the fellowship hall which is due to condensation. This will be taken care of, but is not a major or urgent concern at this time.

Christian Education-67 kids at VBS, 13 youth helpers and 12 adults. \$892.43 was raised by Lucas and Addison Spindler for a charity that provides wigs for kids with cancer. A new curriculum will be used for Sunday School which will be more like VBS. Teachers will not have to commit to every Sunday but would be more of a rotating schedule. Rally Sunday theme will be "Round Em' Up for Jesus" as noted above, with hope to introduce the new Sunday School curriculum/format to kids and families. Policies for Church Mutual will be finalized at the next Christian Ed/Board of Youth meeting.

Youth & Family Ministry-Youth will be going to the Ulness cottage Thursday and Friday this week. Thursday is for 1st-6th grade and Friday 7th-12th.

Personnel Committee- There are 2 candidates for the call committee to interview. Interviews scheduled for next week-one via Zoom and one in person. Call Committee members are: Brian Ulness, Julie Hartman, Ron Jones, Bob Argall, Sue Riesterer, Joan Pritzl, Quinten Robley

Endowment-A donation was made to Lori Krueger.

Open discussion- Policy for renting the Fellowship Hall was discussed, as with the Valders Community Center flooding, more people may approach the church to use our facility. Is there a policy in place or do we need to develop one? If there is no policy, the council will look to develop one.

Motion made to the adjourn the meeting at 7:22 pm. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.
