Thinking About Deeper Things

Pastor Lyman

I was a hospice chaplain for 17 years. I was the person who went to talk to people who were about to die. It was not just Lutherans or Christians. Most of the people I went to see were "none of the above" about religion. They were people in our culture who had celebrated Christmas, but slept in on Easter. They believed in God in their own way, but did not think about death or "the meaning of life" much. Now they were going to die, and it was time to reflect upon such things.

They were not afraid. There were no "death bed conversions." The saying "There are no atheists in foxholes," did not turn out to be true. The nearness of death did not drive people to faith. Fear does not motivate people to faith in Jesus, and I am glad it does not.

I met with them and I told them what I believed about God and Jesus and the resurrection. God is real. Jesus is real. God's love is real. When we die we go be with Jesus. I told them Good News and they were glad to hear it and believe it. Since they believed nothing before, they did not have to start disbelieving their old faith system. Now they had a full and fulfilling faith system and they simply admitted it as their own. Sometimes it is just as simple as that.

Other times there are struggles. Everybody is different. We have had too many deaths of young people in our county. Automobile accidents. Suicide. It is hard. The hardest most difficult thing is outliving your children. It is not the way it ought to be.

I cannot make it alright. We who feel the grief know that nothing can make it "alright." And yet I say by faith that God can comfort that grief. God can mend a broken heart. In our grief we ask "How? How can God bring us joy again?" I do not know how God can do it, but I know God does it. I do not know how God raises the dead either, but I am sure God can do that too.

God can comfort us in all of our grief. And then we can share our journey, share it and share the comfort we ourselves have received. We have a great God. Amen.

Meet Our New Organist

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Faith Lutheran,

Greetings! Since this opportunity of joining the music ministry at Faith arose, I have been attending services when my schedule allows me to, and I've also been listening in to the online services. First, I would just like to say thank you for already making me and my family feel so warmly welcomed. As a visitor, it's typically easy to feel like an "outcast" when visiting a new church... not at Faith.

A little about me...

Since the age of 14, I have been running the family farm. My grandfather was the farmer in our family. In 2014, the Lord took his eyesight from him, and sent me out to the fields and amongst the cattle. Farming is my



passion. It's such a joy to see East River Beef Farms & Custom Harvesting, LLC grow and expand from year to year. I also work a third shift job off the farm at Arla Foods Production in Hollandtown as a machine operator.

I've been playing organ for church since the age of 13. My story is very unlike the structure of most organist's career. The Lord has decided to send me where he needed me. Within the last 11 years, I filled 9 vacancies at churches across the state that either extended a call for a Director of Parish Music, or installed a computerized program for the existing organ in the sanctuary. Within 9 vacancies, I directed choral choirs, and hand bell choirs. I also remain as the main organist at Saint Bartholomew Lutheran in Brillion, and have been for 10 years.

Along with music ministry inside the walls of the church, I also do ministry work outside of the church during my free time, which includes composing and arranging music, and recording "midi audios" for churches who don't currently have a live organist on the bench. I LOVE composing, and the music theory that comes with it. It's very much like a jigsaw puzzle to most. You have all the pieces, it's just putting it all together to form a beautiful picture. I have multiple pieces of music for organ, piano, and hand bells arranged and compiled. I am currently working on composing an organ series with multiple volumes that includes meditations, inspirations, and triumphant postludes. Like farming, it brings me joy to see my collection of compositions grow and prosper, and to hear stories of how my music is able to make a difference in other churches.

I'm excited to be here at Faith. With hopping around from church to church for 11 years, I'm looking forward to finally finding the values of a church family, and the values of getting involved, as well as sharing my music and talent with you all. I'm looking forward to meeting new faces, and worshiping here at Faith!

Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—December 18, 2023

Pastor's Report: Has been visiting shut-ins for their Christmas visits & hospitalized members & will continue this till all have been visited. Christmas pageant had great attendance – 279, which is the result of a successful Sunday School program. Lay Ministry is doing a recognition of those baptized in the past year on the second Sunday in January.

Old Business: Picture Directory – 147 family photos (some as individuals) and about 20 submitted photos. Pictures needed for Faith events. \$760 was made on the quilter's silent auction, which will be used for quilting supplies. \$262 was made on the Advent event, which was donated to Incourage.

New Business: Baptismal Quilt - It was suggested to roll funds in the Baptismal Quilt fund into the Quilter's fund since the Quilters are paying for the supplies for the Baptismal quilts now. Motion made and carried. Library funds – Since the Library has been disbanded, these funds could be moved to another fund. Possible funds to move it to were discussed. A motion was made and carried to move the Library Memorial Funds into the Undesignated Memorial Funds. Hands on Mission, which is overseen by the Board of Evangelism, has been inactive in recent years. The only activity they have is Soup for Souls – a group gets together as needed to make soup for those in need, such as those who have been hospitalized, those who have incurred some type of loss, etc. Soup is also taken to people who are not members of Faith who are in need. It was decided to table this till February 2024 and mention it at the annual meeting for congregational awareness and suggestions.

Council representative reports:

<u>Stewardship</u> – *Stephanie Mittnacht*. Part of the cause for the deficit for 2023 is due to Pastor's moving expenses, which were not budgeted. Interest made on the CD that matured in September, was rolled over into the new CD. Another CD came due December 17th & was renewed (including interest) at a rate of 5.18%. When the budget is printed there will be some corrections: Salary for Youth Coordinator. Insurance for staff was based on an estimate, which came in \$2,000 lower than estimated.

Evangelism – Julie Hartman. Thank-you gifts for the Boards were handed out to take back to the boards at their next meeting.

Lay Ministry - Joyce Sorenson. Wednesday, December 27th – no service.

Fellowship – Marilyn Robley. Thank you to all for the activities that create fellowship for our members.

Property – *Mark Zutz.* More information will be available on estimates for the various projects in time for annual meeting. **Christian Education** – Bridget *Valleskey.* "In as Much Sunday" was a big success. Worked well partnering with Wells. Bridget delivered gifts to Lakeshore Foster Families and Friends and Salvation Army. Reviewed Sunday School Calendar for Winter- Spring 2024. Classes resume January 7 and will run from 10:15-11am. Starting 15 minutes later allows teachers a little extra time to enjoy the service and commune with their families before needing to be in their classrooms to teach. Children's Christmas Program – December 17th. A Thrivent card was used to order snacks, green punch, Grinch ornaments, and Grinch cups for the Sunday School students for after program classroom parties. This card was also used to purchase props for the program. Costumes for the Children's Christmas Program were bought using the supplies budget under the Board of Chrisian Ed.

<u>Youth and Family Ministry</u> – *Gretchen Spindler*. 12 individuals came to sing for the Christmas caroling event at Manitowoc Health Care Center. It was very well received by the residents, and we would consider doing this again next year. Final plans were made for Kids Night Out on December 27th. The event will be held from 6-8pm for children ages 4-10. Ice-skating event planned for February 11th at the Manitowoc Ice Center from 1:30-3:00. Admission is \$5 per person and skate rental is \$2. Upcoming camp and BYG for 3rd-5th graders March 8-10th.

Faith on Fire – *Bridget Valleskey*. Upcoming events include the Synod Youth Gathering for high school students February 16 -18. A summary of the November and December Faith on Fire events was provided including a speaker that came to talk to the group, the Cookie Walk had a profit of \$600 profit after expenses were paid.

Having completed all business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:07 pm. Meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next Meeting: January 15, 2024 Devotions – Don Domrath
