Life Line Screening goes beyond regular checkups to look inside your arteries for signs of plaque build-up



Carotid Artery Disease: An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

Peripheral Arterial Disease (PAD):

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.1

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA): An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead which is a life-threatening medical emergency.

Atrial Fibrillation : A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation, AFib can lead to blood clots, to a ruptured aortic artery, stroke, and heart failure, and other heart-related complications.²

Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—November 20, 2023

New Business: 2024 Proposed Budget Approval: 82 pledges returned for \$213,000 – last year there were 96 pledges returned. \$23,000 was added for the usual members who do not turn in a pledge card. Proposed income was lower for 2024 due to less pledges submitted, pledges being lowered from last year, & losing some higher giving members. Confirmation Camp was increased since we have 18 students going to camp in 2024. Concerns were voiced since the budget has a \$44,583.05 deficit, yet we have a surplus in our checking account from prior fiscal years. Stephanie shared a budget is a best guess scenario, not to be expected to turn out exactly as written. She would expect a net loss within certain months since some expenses run heavy in certain months, and income runs light in certain months. However, when looking at the year as a whole, income has been running reasonably close to what was budgeted & expenditures are often under budget. Motion made and carried to approve the budget as proposed. Annual Election and Budget Meeting date: Motion made and carried to hold the annual meeting on Sunday, January 21, 2024, with a snow date of Sunday, January 28, 2024. Recommendation to hire Devin J. Zahringer as part time organist. Devin's resume was made available to the Council. He is a brilliant organist with extensive experience and has written an organist's book. He is currently committed to playing for a church till January. He will play one Wednesday and one Sunday each month beginning in January. Motion made and carried to hire Devin Zahringer as a part-time organist for Faith. Pastor Emeritus for Pastor Carl Peters: Pastor Dan recommended we give a special honor to Pastor Carl Peters as "Pastor Emeritus of Faith Lutheran Church" due to his long term of service as our Pastor. A special celebration to honor him would be held sometime in 2024. Motion made and carried to honor Pastor Carl Peters as "Pastor Emeritus of Faith Lutheran Church." This would need to be voted on and approved at the annual meeting.

Council representative reports:

Evangelism – Sharing tree items need to be returned by November 29th. All tags were taken, and a third family's needs were requested from the Salvation Army. The additional tags were also taken. Advent resource handouts were ordered and are here. The October 15th Opportunity Day did not result in many members signing up for service opportunities. Christmas postcards with holiday service schedule will be sent to inactive members. Advent by Candlelight 2023 has been planned and will be held on Sunday, December 3rd. Entertainment will be a flute choir and donations will be taken for InCourage. 55 people signed up so far. Christmas cards for service members will be made available for church members to sign. May revisit this for Easter. A chili dinner is planned for February 4th, with sign up in January. Any member/friends may sign up to have a table & we encourage youth and families.

Lay Ministry - Lauren (Pritzl) Kristoff will cover the 10:00 Christmas Eve service on piano. Advent sing-along will be held prior to Sunday Advent services & carol leaders are scheduled. The 5th Sunday Sing-along and potluck went very well. About 50 attended the potluck. The Community Health Day was very educational, and discussion was held on expanding to include other topics and possible CPR Certification. Baptismal recognition will be held on "Baptism of our Lord" Sunday on January 14, 2024, for all members baptized in the last year. This would be similar to the All-Saints Day recognition. Baptismal quilts are now being made by Linda Menza and Tammy Brill. Lay Sacramentarian volunteers are needed to take communion to homebound and nursing home members. Passing of the Peace - alternatives to shaking hands will be encouraged during flu season. Bell Maintenance - \$400 will be taken from Undesignated Memorial Funds and put into the fund for Hand Bell maintenance. **Property** - Gathering proposals for new windows and flooring in Fellowship Hall.

<u>Christian Education</u> – Teachers indicated that the bubblers need to be replaced.

<u>Youth and Family Ministry</u> – 90 dozen lefse were made with 64 dozen pre-ordered. Costs above and beyond the Thrivent gift card were \$63. Funds earned will be split with 50% going to Faith on Fire and 50% to the Board of Youth and Family accounts. Stacy and Eliza Wilker and Landon Pinkerton attended the Junior High Blast at camp the weekend of Nov. 3-5. Fun was had by all. Walk Thru Bethlehem will take place December 6 and 10th. Décor will be minimal and only 7-8 volunteers will be needed. Christmas caroling will take place December 15th at 6:00. Participants should meet at Manitowoc Health and Rehab, and we will return back to church for pizza and snacks after. Kids Night Out Event on December 27th from 6-8. Activities will include cookie decorating, a snowman building competition, crafts, and a movie.

Faith on Fire - A speaker will be here on November 15. Pizza/game night event is planned for November 29th. A cookie walk is planned for December 10th. Journey to Bethlehem escape room event at church on December 13th.

Meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next Meeting: December 18, 2023 at 5:00 instead of 6:30. Devotions – Joan


