I did not notice right away because I seldom come and go by the lower entrance, but pretty soon I saw it: the bench we placed for Pastor Onkka. It looks good there on the way to the playground set. And it is sturdy. It is made out of the very hard local limestone and it consists of two thick legs holding up a thick slab of stone. It ought to endure like Stonehenge.

On the top is carved the three-hand graphic like the one on our 1963 cornerstone. I did not know until someone who was present for the creation of that image told me about it, that the three hands are the actual hand prints of real people. I thought an artist drew them, but they said that these are the hands of the three presidents of the three congregations who came together to make Faith Lutheran Church and build our building together.

On one side of the bench is carved, "Beloved Pastor Robert Onkka." On the other side is a quote from the Gospel of John, chapter 10, "There shall be one flock, one shepherd." The quote points to the work Pastor Onkka did here in uniting 3 congregations into one congregation.

As I write this, the outdoor temperature is minus one, with a wind chill of something like "frostbite below zero." So we will probably choose a nice day around Easter to have a fun procession out to the side lawn to dedicate the bench. But it is a nice thing to add to our church property. Thanks to everyone who made it possible! Pastor Dan



Faith Lutheran Church Minutes — November 17 2025

Pastor's Report-Pastor Dan noted that he attended the funeral service for Pastor Carl Peters on Nov. 14 and officiated at his graveside service at Gjerpen Cemetery on Nov. 15. He also visited Don Johnson in the hospital. Mabel Saunders was baptized on Nov. 11 and Stetson Fochs on Nov. 16. He listed events he attended in the past month, including the Senior Christians Breakfast on Oct. 21, a Synod educational event in Wausau on Nov. 6 and the annual Altar Guild meeting on Nov. 8. He also assisted in lefse making. Pastor also taught the 7th grade confirmation students about the Sacraments on Nov. 12.

New Business

Discussion was held on setting a date for the annual meeting, which needs to be a Sunday in January. A motion was made and carried to set the meeting for Jan. 18, 2026, with Jan. 25 as a snow day, if needed. Budget discussion: Joan provided budget worksheets with information from each of the boards. Discussion was held about ways to decrease expenses: One idea was to see if we could get lower insurance costs because the cost has gone up substantially. Other minor changes were mentioned. It is possible that the costs for some youth activities could be paid for using undesignated funds. The possibility of holding fundraisers was again discussed. Members stressed that we want to avoid drawing down the checking account or cashing in CDs. A question was raised about whether the donations from the chili dinner should go to the church instead of an outside cause. Pastor Dan suggested doing events to bring in money to help support the youth coordinator position, as the program is still growing. A discussion was held about the lefse making event and other activities and who will run it as the leaders step down. Getting more help from parents of the youth involved was mentioned, and making the ministry into a family or intergenerational ministry was discussed in order to get more people involved. The idea is to get more people involved and to have more leaders of the activities because everyone has busy schedules and people get burned out.

Council Representative Reports

Treasurer's Report: Larry presented the report and noted that attendance and collection numbers are up.

Lay Ministry: Jennifer gave a list of upcoming events, including Nov. 30, when Voices of Peace will sing, which is the First Sunday of Advent. Future First Communion services will include having families come forward and have reserved seating. Families will be invited to light candles at the All Saints service and we will move communion from that date. Someone again asked about the use of "catholic" vs "Christian" in the creed, and Pastor Dan noted he will answer any questions people have about why we use "catholic." It was noted that we put \$400 every year aside for bell maintenance. A motion was made and carried to move \$400 from undesignated fund for that purpose.

Evangelism: Julie: Sharing Tree went well this year. Advent by Candlelight is set for November 30.

Fellowship: Marilyn: The third Sunday in December will be the children's Christmas program and a bake sale by Faith on Fire. Fellowship will serve coffee.

Youth & Family Ministry: The program needs money to pay for the Trivia Night for the confirmation and high school youth. The cost is \$10 per participant for up to 30 participants who might come. Bridget has no more money in the confirmation fund. Pastor said the money will be available to cover the cost. In As Much Sunday/Wednesday will be on December 3 and 7 and the gifts will go to the Salvation Army and Lakeshore Foster Families. Have budgeted money to pay 20% toward confirmation camp costs per camper.

Miscellaneous: The church was given a new table for the back of church by Jan Reinertson's family. There was a brief discussion about how to get new members active in church life. Pastor talks to them and they receive a time and talent sheet. It was suggested we consider a new member integration committee.


