Some Assembly Required

I sit to write this article right after the Synod Assembly. It was a good assembly. We engaged in the basic functions of self-governance. We elected people for terms on committees. We approved the budget. We did not make a big deal about these things because we are used to them. But it is nice, especially around Independence Day, to remember that we are governing ourselves. Americans sort of expect to govern themselves, but there are whole denominations in this country that do not allow participatory democracy.

Roman Catholicism, for instance, is pretty much run by the hierarchy of bishops and cardinals. Protestants *ought* to be more democratic, but often fail to be. Even in Baptist denominations that profess "the equality of all believers," the clergy are usually allowed to make all the decisions. In Florida, lots of independent churches are essentially "owned" by the pastor who owns the building and whose income is identical to whatever is collected in offerings. There are democratic movements in many denominations agitating for more "power to the people" but power is released reluctantly.

Not so in our denomination. In the ELCA every nickel is given by the people and counted by the people and spent according to the people's budget —a budget created by the member's elected representatives and voted upon by the whole congregation. We all decide how much to send on to the ministry of the larger church and we elect laypeople to go decide how to spend it when it gets there.

The anti-democratic denominations scoff, "You can't vote on God's Truth." And we agree, but we know that people are sinners and need supervision. We know that those with power tend to abuse those without power. We all feel better about supporting a ministry when everything happens in the sunlight instead of behind closed doors.

And we also know that sometimes God speaks with the voice of the people. When the ministers of America were untroubled by slavery the abolitionists spoke up and changed the nation. When the all-male clergy were contentedly not worrying about women in society, the people (mostly women but some men) enlightened us. And now we have a handful of issues we are studying in the ELCA to determine what God's Truth might actually be about criminal justice or the environment or the proper place of capitalism. We know we can't determine God's Truth by a democratic vote, but we can admit that we don't have a monopoly on it. And in that humble stance we can still figure out the way forward by consulting, and praying, and agreeing together.

### Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—March 18, 2024

Housekeeping Items: Reminder CLEAN UP date APRIL 20<sup>th</sup> 9:00 A.M. till Noon. A 9-yard Dumpster will be delivered to Faith on March 20<sup>th</sup> and plan to keep till after April 20<sup>th</sup> Clean-up Day. The cost is \$250.00 per dump. The dumpster is available for everything and will be placed next to the sidewalk on the lower parking lot. Sanctuary stained-glass window, donated by Don Johnson, looks great at night from the south with the new lighting installed. Thanks to Ken & Tony for installing the lighting for the window. Projection video is fuzzy of choir, students, etc. It may be helpful to adjust lights with a lift when one is available, but the current projector is getting older and has low pixels for the distance it is from the screen (99 feet) Old Business: 2 Firesticks were installed for members unable to get to church to allow viewing of our services from home. Live Stream Congregation ambient mic is up and running again. This mic had been disconnected at some point and was no longer hooked up to our sound system. That resulted in not being able to hear the congregation's responses on our YouTube Livestream & getting a reverb sound instead. With this mic connected, the congregation goes directly to livestream and the sound is much better. Update and discussion on Pastor Peter's celebration: A planning group was organized including Marilyn Robley, Jennifer Ott, Julie Hartman, Joan Pritzl, & Mary Thomsen. Service time will be changed to 10:30 to accommodate a noon meal. A meal will be served at noon, catered by Meat's at about \$20 per person. The cost of the meal will be covered by Faith using Undesignated Memorial Funds. Faith's members attending will be asked to donate salads and desserts. Publicity will include an article in Faith Matters and a half-page ad run twice earlier in April in the Valders Journal. Joan will get the picture of Pastor and Marlene Peters to Mary to be used in the Valders Journal ad. Invitations will be sent out to people of special interest (Pastors and Interns who served with Pastor Peters, his Call Committee (if still living), former Council presidents, etc. Reservations are required for the meal and will be due by April 24<sup>th</sup>. Quilters have chosen a guilt to give to Pastor and Marlene as a gift. It was suggested to give an additional gift of meaning, other than money. A tree planted at Faith was suggested, with a plaque included to indicate the purpose of the tree was to honor Pastor Carl Peters for his many years of service to Faith Lutheran. Motions made and carried to move the time of service that day, May 5<sup>th</sup>, to 10:30 a.m. to accommodate the event, to take funds for meal from Undesignated Memorial Funds and to spend up to \$500 for a tree and placard in Pastor Peters' honor to be planted at Faith.

New Business: Records Retention Policy: Bill put together a Records Retention Policy from various sources he found and gave a copy to Bob, Jill and Christine. The purpose of this policy is so everyone knows how long to keep documents and came about due to the planned cleaning up process. Bob asked how long we should keep QuickBooks backups and it was decided to add this to the policy as written, stating that QuickBooks backups should be kept for five years. Motion made and carried to pass the Records Retention Policy with the amendment for Quick Books.

Council representative reports:

<u>Treasurer</u> – CDs coming due and Bob asked if we want to renew them. After discussion regarding funds needed for parking lot project, it was decided funds could be borrowed from the General Fund if needed before CD comes due and repaid to the General Fund with funds from the CD when it comes due next. This will allow Faith to get the best interest on these funds in the meantime. Motion made and carried to rollover the CDs with interest for 7 months and if money is needed for the parking lot project before it comes due, the funds needed would be borrowed from the General Fund checking account and reimbursed later when the CD comes due.

<u>Fellowship</u> – \$392 has been taken in from Soup and Sandwich with one week to go. People have enjoyed the fellowship, with about 35 people on average attending per week.

<u>Property</u> – The price for the bench for Pastor Onkka will be \$2,228 plus tax. Motion made and carried to order the bench using funds from the Undesignated Memorial Fund to be installed by members of the Property Board. Mark has received window prices and will bring it back to Council after receiving all the quotes. The Property Board will decide if they will install the windows themselves or have them professionally installed (question on whether self-installed will affect the warranty.) Mark indicated that it will likely be fall before they are installed.

<u>Christian Education</u> – Cleaned out the supply closet & cabinets in K/1<sup>st</sup> Grade classroom & relocated craft supplies to those cabinets. Moved Christmas program props from closet behind the stage to the old Sunday School office; so only thing for Sunday School still stored behind the stage are costumes

Youth and Family Ministry – High school and middle school event to Urban Air in Appleton on 2/23/24 was well attended & fun. Preparations are underway for the Easter Breakfast . Spring event will be a Timber Rattlers game for Friday, May 31, and a signup sheet will be available in April.

<u>Faith on Fire</u> – 10 youth + 2 chaperones attended the Smash Art event held at CRusched in Manitowoc on March 13<sup>th</sup> – all had a great time & would consider doing this again. Upcoming events: monthly meeting/Bible study on April 3<sup>rd</sup> & Archery Night on April 17<sup>th</sup> at Maribel Sportsmen's Club

Other Comments: Pastor Dan shared that he appreciates the work of Council and our various boards after talking with other church pastors about issues they have. He is glad people here are paying attention to finances. Mark asked if we could list the percentage of attendance. He suggested having an usher challenge to boost attendance. Pastor Dan shared that he doesn't believe in cleaning the rolls, since doing so has the opportunity to cause hurt feelings. He feels that personal invitations are most likely to encourage attendance in church.

### Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—April 15, 2024

#### Pastor's Report

Pastor Dan prepared a written report due taking vacation time during this meeting. Reported usual monthly attendance at Senior Christians brunch & taking communion to shut-ins. Reported several out-of-town hospital visits for a member and family of a member. Led worship and communion at Angelus on March 20<sup>th</sup> & will again on May 15<sup>th</sup>. Funeral planning visits, one full funeral service, and one private funeral visitation service. Provided attendance comparison for Holy Week services between 2023 & 2024; in 2024 there was an increase of 55 for Palm Sunday, increase of 6 for Maundy Thursday, decrease if 10 for Good Friday, increase of 15 for Easter Sunrise, & decrease of 7 for 9AM Easter.

#### Old Business

Daycare – Waiting for approval to waive fees – If fees are waived, they plan to move forward, if not, it will not be financially feasible. Pastor Peters Day - Gifts to be given include a maple tree with a plaque indicated in honor of Pastor Peters service to Faith. Church Property Policy - discussion on the need for this policy. Motion made and carried to adopt the Church Property policy as proposed.

#### Council representative reports

**Evangelism** – Talked about God's Work Our Hands coming up in September.

<u>Fellowship</u> –Funds brought in from Soup & Sandwich totaled \$484.75, which were given to The Haven & Warming Shelter. There was \$27.67 remaining from the Thrivent gift card for Soup & Sandwich expenses – food items were purchased with those funds and taken to the Warming Shelter. Pastor Peters event: Set up will be on Saturday May 4<sup>th</sup> beginning at 9:00 – Marilyn asked for help from Council or from funeral set-up committee to set up tables and chairs.

<u>Property</u> – Asphalt Company will be sending a bid soon. Window bids are coming in – some are quite competitive.

<u>Christian Education</u> – Noisy offerings brought in \$314.69, which was used to purchase the new risers that allow all students to be seen when they sing in front of church. Singing 3 songs on Mother's Day & hoping to prepare a slide show of members with their mother. Volunteers needed for VBS - 6/17 – 6/20. Larry took Confirmation students & several adults to the synagogue in Sheboygan on Saturday, April 8<sup>th</sup>. Three students have prepared for Confirmation, Tristan Teuke, Molly Junk and Gage Spindler. Final requirements to be completed by/on Wednesday, April 24th, include Confirmation Faith statements due, Confirmation stoles will be made, and Confirmation interviews will be held. Confirmation will be May 19<sup>th</sup>. Mentors are needed for 9<sup>th</sup> grade students, especially since the next couple years there will be larger classes. Meet for one hour on Sunday morning once a month. Be available for student questions if they arise. Motion made and approved to accept Tristan Teuke, Molly Junk, & Gage Spindler for Confirmation pending approval by Pastor Dan and Bridget Valleskey related to completion of final requirements.

Youth and Family Ministry –Served over 100 people at Easter Breakfast – compared to 70 to 80 last year. Discussed having a Kid's Night Out going to a Timber Rattler's game in May & another on May 22<sup>nd</sup> with outdoor games & snacks.

Faith on Fire: April  $28^{th}$  – Hwy cleanup after service on Hwy J. May 8 – Regular meeting with Bible Study. May 29 – Campfire night with new Confirmed members
