### The Truth!

I remember as a young man of faith reading the Bible, that I read widely *about* the faith. Different writers would say, "The Biblical proof for this is in the Bible at such-and-such chapter and verse." So I would look up the verse and find nothing like proof for what the person was asserting.

So I was relieved when I got to college and seminary and they were careful and scholarly about the Bible, and were NOT talking a lot of hooey. Some of the smartest people you will ever meet are scholars of the Bible. Also the most profoundly faithful.

We Lutherans are "people of the book." We have our special book that records our inherited experiences with God, and we study and learn from the experiences recorded. We Lutherans go back to the Bible as our authoritative teacher. Luther himself coined the phrase "sola scriptura" scripture alone.

There are Protestants who do not take it as seriously as we do. Some would rather have an experience of the Holy Spirit in their services and weight that as more important than what the Bible might say ("The Bible says a lot of things, but the Holy Spirit was clear last Sunday" they'd say.) Other denominations or independent congregations use the Bible however they please. If the preacher doesn't know what a Bible passage means, they will not try to figure it out, they will just preach what they "feel like" it means.

Lutherans, on the other hand, look up the original Hebrew and Greek and study what the society was like in ancient times. We require our pastors to take Hebrew or Greek. I have taken classes in both. But our professors of the Bible study so much of these languages that they dream in Koine Greek. They know them well enough to converse in them. But they also know a few dead languages! Archaeologists discovered a previously unknown language related to ancient Hebrew. Written in cuneiform. Written on clay tablets that were fired when the palace burned down. Suddenly all the scholars figured out the new ancient language and compared it to the Hebrew we knew. And then the Hebrew made better sense. Our translations got better.

I was looking at the books on my shelf and thinking about the hours of devoted work that went into shining better light onto the wonderful Biblical stories to enlighten our lives. We have a wonderful tradition of fine scholarship. A great blessing in our tradition. — *Pastor Dan*

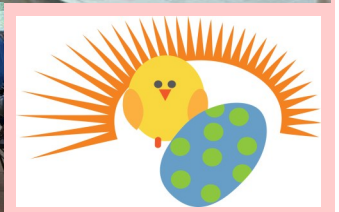

# Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—March 23, 2026

## *Pastor's Report*

Pastor noted he has been doing 2 sermons all month with Lent and area pastors have traded pulpits for Lenten service. There was one baptism in the past month. Lenten meals and Ash Wednesday have gone well. The snowy weather canceled the March 15 service and closed the office the next day. The memorial service for Charley and Veryl Hein has been changed to an indoor service.

## *New Business*

*Membership Process*—Julie discussed having a letter set up for inactive members with questions about their membership and their circumstances. Pastor noted that it's difficult not to hurt feelings as this is an extended-family congregation, and those who have moved away want to be buried here one day and still consider themselves members. Hurt feelings have happened in the past when inactive members were removed from the membership rolls. Tanya brought up the possibility of using ChatGPT to write a good letter. After a discussion about the relatively minor matter of not having exact numbers, the council decided to fine tune the letter for the board to review next week. Loren suggested we make it clear that we want people to remain members unless they say they don't want to remain. A new draft will be presented in April.

*Climate Survey*—Jim noted that from his discussions with some members last month showed that congregation members have a lot of passion for the church. The executive committee wants to do a climate survey with all members. The council reviewed a draft. The format allows people to rate items on scale of 1-10, which allows easy comparison in future years. The survey will be anonymous. Motion was made to do the climate survey. (Jim will fine tune it and Tanya will do an electronic version. The council later voted on specifics by email.) Motion passed and carried.

*Laptop update for projection system*—We need to make the software versions between the office and the projection system upstairs compatible. The one used for videos is an older version than the one used in the office, so the videos aren't working properly. Motion to purchase Windows 365 for the video computer upstairs was made and carried. The motion was amended later when it was discovered that the planned software installation did not solve the problem and a computer upgrade was necessary. The council voted via email. Motion made and carried to purchase a new laptop from Cybertechs of Manitowoc, using money from the Undesignated Memorial Fund.

*Synod Assembly candidates & registration*—Nobody was elected at the annual meeting. It will be announced that we need someone to attend. The Assembly is June 4-6 in Oshkosh. The bishop will be re-elected/elected at that time.

## *Council Representative Reports:*

### *Treasurer's Report*

Terry presented a written report showing February income, expenses, loss and checking balance; CD schedule; attendance for February. It was noted that wages were over budget because custodian Tony Schad put in extra hours as Rose Behnke was trained. Snow removal for February was also over budget at \$2,200.

### *Lay Ministry*

Jennifer: Pine Haven choir performance is planned and youth services will be on April 22 and 26. The May 10 service will open with a contemporary song as the call to worship, and we aim to do that once a month. DVDs of worship services have been in poor focus. The council discussed why DVDs are made. They are sent to members in nursing homes and shut-ins. If we eliminate the DVD player it won't cause blurry focus.

### *Evangelism*

Ted: Discussed addition of two new members. The final Lenten Soup and Sandwich meal will be this week. The new member process was taken off the board's agenda to have the council discuss it. In current practice, Pastor calls any guest who puts a request for a call on the communion card and discusses ways for them to participate and invites them to be received into membership. It was noted that it would be good to have someone assigned to help get new members acclimated to the congregation, with the first step being someone at the welcome desk.

### *Fellowship*

A notice will be put in the bulletin that a director is needed for the Board of Fellowship.

### *Church Properties*

Loren noted we have received the contract to fertilize and spray for dandelions for \$900. There was a discussion about whether the whole service is needed. Loren said he could spray for dandelions without fertilizing for about \$100. The contract will automatically renew, so a call needs to be made to cancel it.

### *Christian Education*

VBS is being planned.

The council adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 7:50 p.m. Motion to adjourn. Next Meeting is on April 20 at 6:30 p.m. Devotions by Julie. –Submitted by: Mary Thomsen, secretary
