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One Hundred Seventy-Five Years!

Last Sunday, October 12th, we celebrated the chartering of our congregation 175 years ago. Think of all the thousands of people who have heard the word of God here, and come to faith in Jesus here. Think of the millions of prayers offered here and by the people of Faith Lutheran Church wherever they may be in the world.

At the celebration we had historical displays, thanks to the research of Al Gilbertson and the artistic talents of Judy Valleskey. I put a book of our history out, and immediately an attendee pointed to the page of congregation members who had gone into the Lutheran ministry. "That's my uncle!" she said. It was a full page of members who had gone into ordained ministry. Each pastor probably had 40 or 50 years in ministry at 4 or 5 different churches. So the unique "flavor" of our congregation has gone into the whole region, and through each of us, into the whole world. What a family connection!

I was fortunate enough to be the pastor of a congregation as they reached their 50th anniversary. The children of the charter members were now the pillars of the church. In our Sunday School we had a coffee can full of crayons. We had other bins full of crayons, but the coffee can held our oldest crayons. They were missing their wrappers and some had nearly been used up. I asserted that some of the crayons in that can were the remnants of the first crayons on the first Sunday School class 50 years before. And the children of the church had drawn Noah's ark and rainbows, manger scenes and herald angels, scenes of cross and resurrection. Those drawings went out to be posted on the refrigerators at home and at grandma's house and in their rooms: colorful signs of faith growing in young hearts. Those current pillars of the church had, as children, wielded those crayons and tasted them and drawn with them. Think of the acres of drawing from all of those crayons over all that time. Every object in the church building (and many in your homes) could tell a similar story of growing faith.

Of course the Crayola example would not work at a church 175 years old. Crayola crayons were not invented and sold until 1903. We had already celebrated our 50th anniversary by then!

The celebration at the Franciscan Center was very good. Good fellowship, good food, good preaching, and good singing. Our choir sang with the choir of First Lutheran and they sounded very good together!

175 years is a landmark. We are not done celebrating it yet. We will soon dedicate the bench memorializing Pastor Onkka which is in place near the playground. And it feels like this year's Lefse making on November 14th which is always a celebration of our Norwegian heritage, is a natural part of our anniversary celebrations. Share your ideas about how to celebrate some more!

The Reverend Anne Edison-Albright

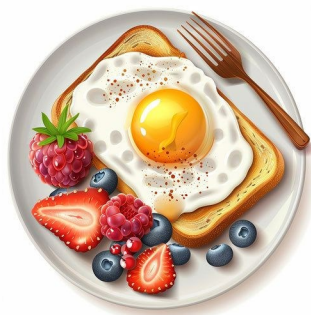
Bishop of the East Central Synod of Wisconsin—ELCA

The Rev. Anne Edison-Albright serves as bishop of the East Central Synod of Wisconsin. She previously served as Director of College Ministries and College Pastor at Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, and as pastor at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Stevens Point, Wisconsin. She earned a BA in English and a BA in journalism from Michigan State University; completed her MDiv at Yale Divinity School, and a year of Lutheran formation at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia (now United Lutheran Seminary).

Bishop Anne has been a regular writer and curriculum editor for Augsburg Fortress and Sparkhouse since 2008. Her current ministry has been enriched by experience teaching high school ESL and English; her time as a short term missionary in China and Slovakia; and a year of residency as a hospital chaplain. Growing up connected to the ELCA churchwide expression through her parents—Paul and Sue Edison-Swift, and their work in communication and IT for the churchwide organization—formed Bishop Anne's active faith and lived experience of the wide and radically inclusive Body of Christ.

The Edison-Albright Family—Anne, Sean, Walter and Sally—live in Appleton and are members of Christ the King in Combined Locks and Christus in Greenville. The Edison-Albrights love Star Trek, Star Wars, baking and gardening together, and sharing their favorite new music and podcasts.

¹ Council voted in December 2022 to set aside \$100,000 of Faith's checking account balance to fund the Youth Coordinator position. The balance remaining is \$17,533.55.

Although the Youth Coordinator salary is included in current year expenses, which affects Net Income/Net Loss, it is not paid with current year income.

In that moment, I was so moved that I couldn't even get the words out. The beauty and the truth of those lyrics, intertwined with the powerful harmony of voices and the power of the organ pipes, all praising Christ together, brought me to tears. I wept not only because of the music itself, but because it reminded me of my own sinfulness...and even more so, of the overwhelming grace of God that redeems it.

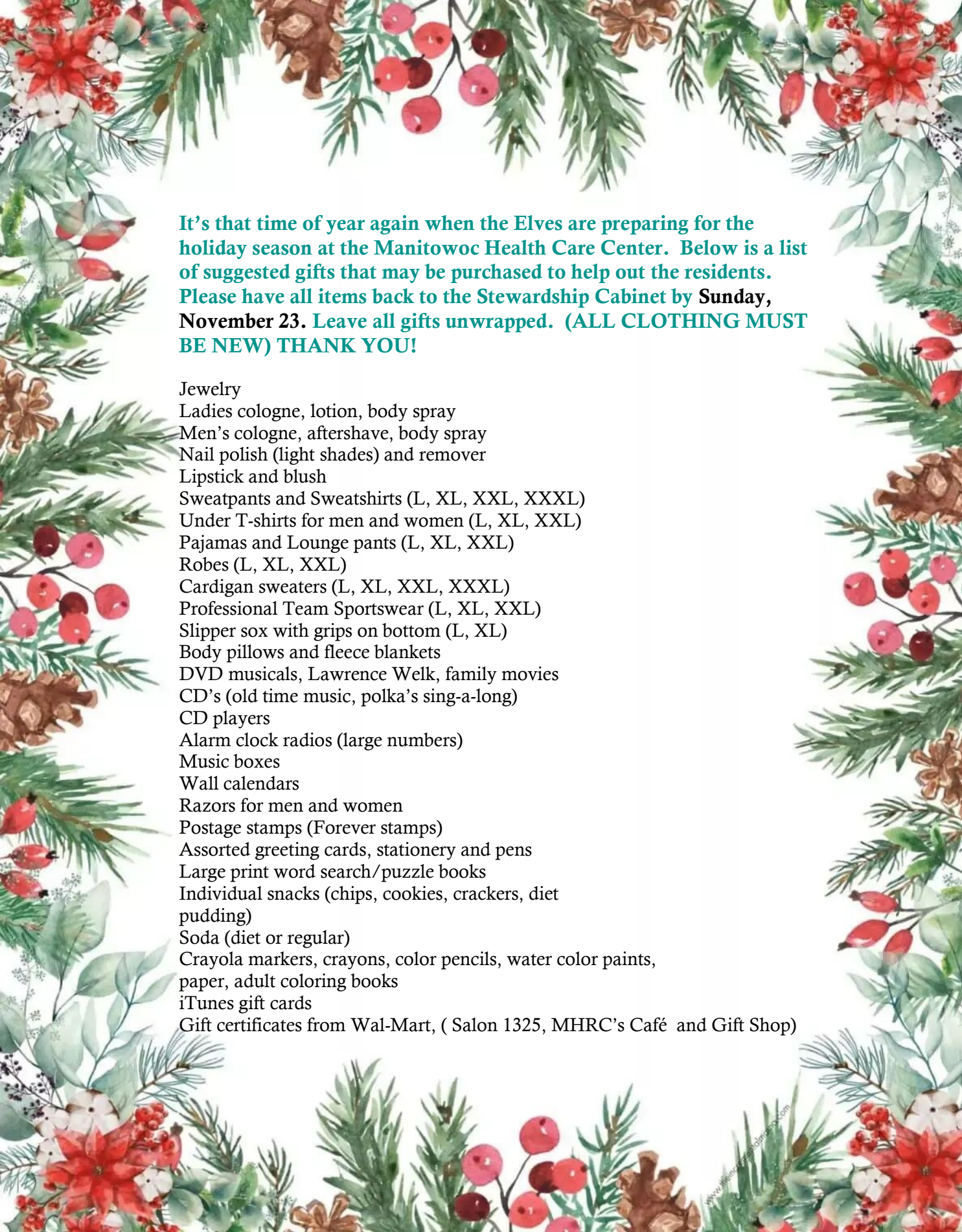

Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—September 15, 2025

Pastor's Report: There have been no funerals in past month. Janet Reinertson died on the morning of the meeting and funeral plans were pending. Forrest John Newburg was baptized on Sept. 7, and his father, Logan, took the opportunity to also join Faith Lutheran Church. Stetson James Fochs was scheduled to be baptized on Oct. 5 and more baptisms were being planned. Pastor visited several members at various care centers and brought them communion: Ron and Connie Torrison, Virginia Meyer, Jerry Hoefner, Bertha Kulnick, Esther Halverson, Larry and Sharon Naidl and Jim and Jan Reinertson.

Housekeeping Items: The Green Bay Conference of the East Central Synod is now asking for dues based on \$1 per congregation member. Larry asked what Faith receives for its membership in the conference, which is made up of area churches. Pastor said he is unsure what the conference will do with the money. The council discussed its need to know about such things ahead for budgeting purposes. Bob will look over the budget for possible money to support the request. 564 confirmed members.

Old Business: Camera Fund: All needed funds have been raised for the new projection system, which is more than \$18,000, including memorials for Bill Riesterer. Time and Talent sheets are ready to go out.

New Business: Bob Pautz will be leaving and he is currently Christine's backup for making PowerPoints for worship services. We need to find more volunteers. Ken O'Leary is retiring as custodian effective Dec. 31, 2025. We will need to find a replacement. The camera equipment will be installed the last week of September and Larry will work with the company to set up a training program for people who volunteer. The first Wednesday in October will not have a livestream. AED: Larry asked about a refresher course for people to learn to use the AEDs in the church. He wants people trained to avoid any liability. Pastor said he would ask Valders Ambulance to teach people about using both AEDs as they are different. We would like to do it after Sunday and Wednesday services one week. Confirmation Plans-Larry noted that he, Jim Schuessler and Bridget have been working on a new confirmation curriculum since January. The information for 9th grade is kept in a binder with needed forms and lessons stored in a box and available to anyone who needs it. Anyone who wants to look at it can ask to see it. Work on the 7th and 8th grade curriculum is nearly done. Motion made and carried to thank Jim Schuessler and his team for his work on the confirmation program.

Council representative reports

Treasurer's Report-Bob: Through August, average weekly offerings this year are \$5,714, down from \$5,785 last year, or \$81 per week. Year-to-date offerings are \$194,267, down \$2,752 from \$197,019 at this point last year. Contributions are up for the month of August, \$4,467 this year to \$3,528 last year. Average weekly attendance is 143, compared to 161 last year.

Pastor Dan noted that we need \$2,000 to pay for Faith's portion of the 175th anniversary celebration for the original church. The money will be taken from the general fund and we will roll over a CD that is coming due. (For the celebration of the 175th, on Oct. 12, Faith will send the 3 church models and antique crosses and a processional cross for the event. We want to have a historical display about the church. Also considering poster displays of key moments in congregation's history.)

Lay Ministry—Jennifer: New hand chimes for bell choir will be bought with money from the bell choir account. Kids can use them if they want when they sing.

Evangelism—Julie: God's Work, Our Hands was successful with many people helping. They are now working on Advent By Candlelight, set for Sunday, Nov. 30.

Fellowship—Marilyn: Thanks go out to donors for Fellowship treats. They served 42 people at the Senior Appreciation lunch.

Christian Education-Alyssa/Bridget-About 40 students are enrolled in Sunday school. The first Wednesday night confirmation session for 9th grade went well with everyone attending. Parents of 9th grade parents received a letter about the changes that have been made. Bibles were distributed to six seventh graders, nine third graders, five 3K students and two students new to 4K.

Youth & Family Ministry—Bridget: Faith on Fire was set to begin on Wednesday, Sept. 17. Worship service planned with a bonfire and beanbag competition afterward. On Nov. 1, they will do a scarecrow-making competition at Otto's and have the congregation vote on them. On Oct. 15 there will be parent/student meeting about the National Youth Gathering for 7th-11th graders, which will be June 28-July 2, 2027, in Minneapolis. Haunted Golf Cart Rides are planned on Sat. Oct. 18.

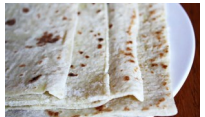

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CHURCH CUSTODIAL POSITION

Faith Lutheran Church is looking to fill the custodial position presently held by Ken O'Leary since 2019. This is a part time position of approximately twelve hours per week. Hours are somewhat flexible as long as certain critical tasks are completed. Tasks to be performed are typical housekeeping actions such as vacuuming, mopping, dusting, sanitizing rest rooms and other church facilities. Also required is setting up and taking down of tables and chairs, etc. for various events. In addition, minor repairs, managing supply levels as well as setting up and taking down of items in the church sanctuary for funerals, weddings, and other events. The ability to use a step ladder is a necessity in order to perform some tasks. Prior experience is helpful but not required. Training will be available.
