

We would like to thank everyone who donated money or items to support our confirmation project during the week of VBS. We were able to deliver several supplies, as well as tie blankets, to Hope House in Manitowoc and also sent a check for \$165 to Operation Kid to Kid. This program, through World Vision, provides warm clothing and blankets to families in North America who may not otherwise be able to afford them. A \$5 donation can provide up to \$70 in new clothing and blankets through the partnerships this organization has in place, so the \$165 sent will be equivalent to over \$2000 to bless those in need. FOOD: non-perishable food items.

GIFT CARDS: gas, groceries, local stores, movie rentals, calling cards. Any gift cards or cash can be left in the church office for pick up.

Anything purchased for the center should be clearly marked inCourage and placed inside the stewardship cabinet near the church office. Any gift cards or money can be brought to the church office. Thank you for your continued support.

Upcoming Youth Events



Faith on Fire will spend a fun evening at Otto's Pumpkin Patch on Wednesday, October 1st. The teams will build a scarecrow to be taken back to Faith Lutheran Church, where they will be on display and all the members of Faith Lutheran can vote on their favorite! We will attend the Service together, and those who wish to can carpool to Ottos. (Students are also welcome to meet us at Otto's at 7:15.) This event is expected to conclude by 9:00 p.m.



Saturday, October 18th (rain date Oct. 25). Faith on Fire will get their spook on at the Haunted Golf Cart Rides at Hickory Hills Golf Course in Chilton. High School students must pre-register by Wednesday, October 1st. Our reservation time will be posted on Team Reach when it gets closer! We will meet up for ice cream that night as well!



Our 4th-grade students will be having a Communion Retreat on Sunday, October 5th! Due to bread baking and chalice making, this event will run over our normal Sunday School hour. 4th graders will need to be picked up at 11:30 on this day! Students must register for this event to ensure we have enough chalices available! Please let your child's teacher or our Youth Coordinator know if your 4th grader will be attending this special event!

First Communion Sunday will be celebrated for the 4th-grade students on Sunday, October 19th. These students will not have class that day so that they may celebrate with family and friends. Before heading out after service, we encourage families to join in fellowship, as there will be a cake in their honor!

We ask all interested students and parents in these grades to attend our first National Youth Gathering Meeting. Faith Lutheran Church Minutes— August 18 2025

Housekeeping Items: Larry--He is the new contact for security issues, along with anyone else who needs to know whom to contact in the event of a security issue. Many things that Bill used to do have to be taken care of by somebody else. Bridget noted that Valders Fire Chief Chris Dallas will check the AEDs every six months during fire extinguisher checks and will install the new AED at church once we get a box for it. Motion made and carried to buy a box for the new AED. The north doors had a problem with shutting properly. Loren worked with the door company and fixed the issue, which was caused by having two sweeps on the bottom. We will need new sweeps for winter for energy/temperature reasons. Main doors also would not shut properly and he worked on the top latch and fixed it.

New Business: We need to have money in the budget for the youth coordinator salary, so all boards are asked to be mindful of that. A question arose about which posts need approval before being put on the church's Facebook page. Pastor said he will take responsibility to approve posts. Motion made and carried that church events can be posted without approval, but other posts should go to Pastor and then the council, if needed. People are being trained to do things that Bill did, such as videos for the screen. Loren, Al and Larry met with Carter Lenzner about doing DVDs for funerals and Al will fill in for funerals in that role. Discussion was held about the need to have more than one person understand processes and technology so there is not another situation like this if someone is no longer able to fulfill duties for any reason. Julie suggested having a written explanation of duties in case something happens to the person who normally does a task. Pastor wants everyone on council to learn about the new cameras. Motion made and carried to require that a minimum of two people attend any training, with documentation and/or video done, too.

Council representative reports:

Treasurer's Report-through July, average weekly offerings are \$6,036, down \$581 from last year. Year to date offerings are \$171,830, down more than \$7,000. Total expenses are up more than \$20,000. Joan noted that the Fellowship expenses are up because of a change in how the money from donations is handled. The money is now placed in the former memorial account and at the end of year, that money will be used to pay expenses, rather than using the money donated in the dish every single time something is purchased. Report also noted that attendance is also down.

Stewardship-Joan: Time and talent sheets can be handed in if boards have them done. Stewardship drive will be done the first three weeks of October on Sundays and Wednesdays with the theme of "Time, Talents, Treasure." They are still looking for people to speak about how they use their time, talents and treasures for God's purposes and why it's important and how they would hope to use it. God gives us the gifts, how do we use it for his purposes?

Lay Ministry-Jennifer—Pine Haven Choir is schedule to be here March 29, but that's Palm Sunday, when the Sunday school children normally sing. Bridget noted the Board of Christian Education doesn't want to move the children's singing day. Pastor suggested we should contact Pine Haven to change date. The list of people available to do the livestreaming is down to three and more are needed. Loren said it doesn't pay to train new people until the new cameras come, but we should get more people. It was recommended last year to hire someone to do the camera work, but Bill didn't want that and the council didn't vote for it. But it is something to think about. Loren suggested putting notices in the bulletin and Faith Matters noting that volunteers are needed. Jennifer was given a suggestion to have Sue Riesterer share her talent on a local TV channel, which brought up the topic of doing something to recognize her after more than 50 years as organist. Evangelism: Julie—They made it through the parade successfully. God's Work, Our Hands is set for Sept. 7. Projects are listed in the gathering space and bulletin. Lunch will be sloppy joes and hot dogs.

Fellowship: Marilyn—They are preparing to help with God's Work, Our Hands and will make Soup for the Souls. People should take the soup along when visiting people who are homebound. They are working on plans for a senior and quilters appreciation day and will be able to use a Thrivent card that was received.

Church Properties: The Onkka bench is still not started, with the date now probably in mid-September. The group may make the block foundation in the next few weeks.

Christian Education-Alyssa: The Sunday school teachers are set. Confirmation is set only on Wednesdays this year. Blessing of the Backpacks will be done on Sept. 7. She asked about running background checks on volunteers. Pastor feels we should do that. Larry agreed to work on that.

Youth & Family Ministry: Tanyia: Lefse making and Easter Breakfast prep are scheduled. They have discussed difficulties in planning events and will be meeting quarterly with the Board of Christian Education to work together more. They just need more volunteers to do everything as it's hard for the few people on the board to do more. Adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.


