In View of a Century

I was putting some old files into their filing cabinet and I ran across an old timeline I had made. It showed the events of Luther's time. The timeline ran about 100 years, from 1453 when Gutenberg printed his first Bible on the new printing press, to a century later when Luther died, and the Protestant Reformation had changed history. Henry the 8th had been king of England. The Renaissance was happening. DaVinci was painting.

Any span of a century is sort of arbitrary, but in retrospect, they are amazing. My mother and I were talking about my great-grandmother and how she left Sweden in the potato famine (the same one that starved the Irish) and came to America. She was a girl in America in 1903 when the Wright brothers invented the airplane, and she lived into the 1970s, so she saw the invention of television and she watched Armstrong and Aldrin walk on the Moon in 1969.

I took the guided tour through the WW2 submarine in Manitowoc, and although it was really fascinating, in 2024 it seemed very antique. We recently watched the "Band of Brothers" series and, similarly, the WW2 weapons and vehicles all seemed very old and primitive in comparison to modern warfare. As a kid, watching all the war movies of WW2, only 20 years after the war, they looked okay. But now the propeller planes and bare bones Jeeps stand out. Today's jets and missiles and drones and satellite images, I suppose, will one day seem antique also.

So far in my century we have gone from huge black enamel Royal typewriters, to electric typewriters, to computers. And from black bakelite phones, to having no landline but having computer phones in our pockets that are smarter than we are. We have, finally, a successor to the printed book (born about 1453) in that about any words we need can be accessed on our phone or tablet or computer. We went from compasses and tiny magnetic needles to Global Positioning Satellites (GPS) with clever devices that can discern the slight differences in signals sent at the speed of light from the various satellites to show on a screen, "Kwik Trip in 0.2 miles!" And Captain Kirk has actually gone into space! It is a Brave New World we live in.







Faith Lutheran Church Minutes—July 15, 2024

New Business: Laser Projector, church visits update

Pastor Dan, Larry, and Bill were able to visit St. Francis of Assisi to observe their setup. This church is physically most like our needs if we were to update with this type of projector. The length of throw is about the same as ours; ours being 100', theirs is 112'. In their findings, the group found the picture to be very crisp, with excellent color, its appearance like that of TV. The biggest concern is the cost (+/-\$14,000). While the color on their images absolutely pops, we currently use more text than image. Our system has been tweaked and its contrast has improved making it clearer to see, but it is still not as good as what they saw from the laser projector at St. Francis of Assisi. Knowing we will have to change eventually we do still have a little time before it becomes an immediate issue. This would be a plug and play system and would take only about a day to install. If we stay with 8,000 lumens, we can use supporting equipment already here. Therefore, the recommendation is that we should keep this in mind for the budget, and maybe put money aside to save for it. Motion made and carried to create a fund specifically for projection replacement. It will be put under Memorial Funds, started with the remainder of the unused funds from the Stephen Ministry Fund.

Camp items: Pastor Dan brought up that Chase Wilker had been a counselor at the camp and is involved in a lot of leadership activities. While at the camp this year, his guitar was broken; the cost to repair it would be about \$300. Pastor Dan proposed that we pay that cost, and in return he would play 3 times for church. Pastor Dan, stating that for many people who go into the ministry as a career, many of them point to their camp years as having had great influence on their decision, he proposed an idea for counselor salaries. These young people currently make \$310/week for 11 weeks, + \$20 as a bump if the individual returns the following year, another \$20 the next year after. Pastor Dan's proposal would be that we pay for the salary (totaling \$3850 for 2025); it would not always necessarily be a counselor from Faith. Motion made and carried to make the Stephen Ministry funds available to pay for guitar repairs for Chase Wilker and allow Bridget to implement this. Motion made and carried to move the balance of any funds in Stephen Ministry funds over to Undesignated Funds.

<u>Treasurer</u> – *Bob Pautz*: Income for June was \$23,956.98. Expenses for June were \$27,757.82. Month of June EOM Net Income is \$(3,800.84). Year-to-date Net Loss, as of June 30 is \$(11,678.04). Balance remaining in Youth Coordinator Restricted Funds, as of EOM June 2024, is \$55,894.54. Comment: Difference in amounts "in and out" between profit and loss last year when compared with this year while figures appeared to be similar; this is due to the manner of entry regarding money donated to, then paid out by the church for the new stained-glass window.

<u>Stewardship</u> – Joan Pritzl: Under Memorial accounts, they want to change some names of funds for easier understanding. These were discussed and a few changes were made. Motion made and carried to change memorial account names as follows: Change the name of Capital Expanded Ministry to <u>Community Ministry Fund</u>. Change the name of Local Benevolence to <u>Member Benevolence Fund</u>. Change the name of Memorial/Inheritance/Interest Account to <u>Undesignated</u> Fund.

<u>Lay Ministry</u> – *Jennifer Ott*: Concern was brought up about the light in the sanctuary that is dimming and brightening during the service. Aside from the fact it is not working properly, it is distracting. This is being investigated. Don Domrath has retired as director of the Inspirational Choir, so we need to look for a replacement. We will need to budget for things needed for the Meeting Room (former Library).

<u>Evangelism</u> – *Julie Hartman*: They will have a float in Valders parade- its theme will be "S'more time with Jesus". Window cling decals— they need to know which package to buy. Julie gave us the various packages and their prices, stating there would be a set-up charge if we include our logo which will add \$25. We decided to purchase the package of 500 at a cost of \$800, with the logo and set-up charge for a total of \$825. It will be paid for by using money from the Undesignated Memorial fund.

Fellowship – Marilyn Robley: Several things are being planned, mostly in September, listed as follows:

September 8th -Gods work. Our hands. September 11th -Senior Appreciation luncheon. September 15th -Sunday School begins. September 29th -Pastor is thinking about doing a Healing Service. October 6th -Oktoberfest with a Potluck.

<u>Property</u> – *Mark Zutz:* WPS is going to lower our utilities. This is based on what we've used this year. The window people will be coming to finalize plans for the new windows.

Christian Education – *Alisa Madson:* They need fun kits.

<u>Youth and Family Ministry</u> – *Gretchen Spindler:* We were given a reminder of the mini golf outing at Manitowoc Aquatic on the 19th.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer at 8:17 pm. Next Meeting: August 19. Recorded by Judy Harris


